OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

Report on Operations Committee Meeting

Mr. Miller reported that the last meeting took place on May 13th. He said the committee reviewed the Cafeteria financial report, the Board financial report, one transfer of appropriation, had a brief discussion about the budget, discussed the new high school athletic regulation policy, and the new attendance, Absences policy and regulation. He stated that they also had a brief update on negotiations.

ADMINISTRATION

Administrative Report

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Dr. Menzo gave his administrative report as listed below.

- A parent SEE meeting was held on May 11th. It was a six hour session with parents attending from all schools. He announced that the program will be eleven weeks of two hour sessions. The parents will then attend a Board meeting in October
- Nine grants were submitted which were written by teachers and administrators
- He announced that we will be partnering with CEA to collaborate and offer teachers support with the Common Core Standards. He said a survey in terms of their readiness will be made of all teachers to determine their level of readiness to offer help to other teachers.
- He announced that there will be no school for students on Friday, May 24th but teachers will have a professional development day.
- A High School Innovation team will be established next year based on available funding. The
 members of the team will teach either on day A or B with the off day as an opportunity to complete
 research and work on implementing the high school reform plan. If funded, the team will consist of four
 teachers from each high school.
- He met with the Alternative High School students to look at the drawings and make suggestions for what the classrooms will look like. They will come to see the Sheehan space next Tuesday. On June 6th the parents of those students will come with the students to see the actual drawing of the floor plans.
