QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION

Chet Miller, came before the Board to explain that a unit from Connecticut was deployed to Kosovo on a humanitarian project to help children change their lives by learning English. The airmen take classes to learn how to instruct the students in English literacy and they take the proficiency test, TOFAL, so that they can go to college or get jobs. The 169th Air Battalion instructs the classes and they raise money to help the students who can't afford the tests. They raise money by making waffles for all the international troops. Post 187 of the American Legion has formed a committee with other organizations in town to be able to collect the supplies needed and ship them to Kosovo. The needs are for waffle mix, syrup, waffle irons, pencils, paper, calculators and composition books.

Dr. Menzo explained that a flyer will be going home with students asking that supplies be donated and brought to the schools so that they can be collected and sent to Kosovo.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mr. Votto reported that Highland School received \$5,000 from the PTO and Yalesville also received \$5,000 from the PTO. He also acknowledged the Gaylord Hospital for assisting with the clinical preparation of the Wallingford Adult Education's Certified Nursing Assistant program at the approximate cost of \$37,000. He went on to thank the Masonicare Health Center for their assistance with the program which cost approximately \$25,000.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

A.C.E.S. Representative

Mrs. Castelli reported she attended the meeting on September 10th. There was the annual recognition of students and staff. There was a presentation by an architectural firm to give an estimate about how much it would cost to consolidate the Whitney East, West and North schools into one building on Leeder Hill Road in Hamden. The estimate came in at \$82 million dollars for the purchase of the land and the building. The state reimbursement is 80% therefore, ACES would be responsible for 16.5 million with a move in date of 2018-2019 school year. The new building will have room for expansion also. ACES will either sell, lease or re-envision the old buildings. She said the budget is in deficit and they kept the tuition costs with no increase.

Sal explained that at the next meeting on October 8th there will be discussion about the State Board of Education Strategic Planning. ACES Governing Board will take topics and suggestions from Board of Education members in the state. He suggested that Board members give Mrs. Castelli the information so that she can take it back to the Governing Board. He stated at the next SCASA meeting the Superintendents will also participate in a focus group.

Wintergreen Magnet School Steering Committee

Mr. Votto stated that the first meeting of this year will be on Wednesday.

School to Career Representative/BusinessThinkTank

Dr. Menzo reported that the meeting was held a couple of weeks ago and was well attended. He stated that there was a Capstone update. He announced that the next meeting is in November.

Mr. Bolat added that there was discussion about the intern program.

PTAC Update

Dr. Menzo reported the PTAC meeting was about three and a half hours long since there was discussion about a number of topics. He said he is happy to report that many more parents are participating. He reported that they are welcoming Walkthroughs to assess the school community.

Lyman Hall Athletic Complex Improvement Committee

Mr. Deptula reported they are still on schedule. He stated that the paving should be done this week but only if it doesn't rain.

Plan of Conservation Development

Mr. Bolat reported there was an Open House where the public could see the work on all four projects and they were able to vote where the focus should be. One suggestion was to improve the Community Lake area.
