

For your book talk, you must create a symbolic handout that represents a key element of your book.

Ex. Harry Potter – lightening bolt, wand, owl Twilight – apple, wolf, clouds

## On your symbolic handout, you must include the following information:

- ◆ Title of book
- Author of book
- Genre of book
- Summary of book (including setting, characters, & plot)
- Recommendation of book (who would like this book?)

## Your handout will be used to help present your book. In the book talk you must present the following information:

- Introduce the book in a creative way. Be sure to state the Title, Author and Genre of the book.
- Briefly summarize the book without giving away the ending. Tell your classmates about the book you read. Provide information that will make them want to read it too!
  - one (most interesting, your favorite) of the main characters.
  - Describe the setting of the book. Tell us when and where the story took place.
- Give your opinion of the book.
- Recommendation of book (who would like this book?)
- ◆ YOU MUST BRING THE BOOK TO PRESENT.
