Pitman Pride Time

Innovative Tier II/III Intervention

Never Settle, Never Quit...Roll Pride!

Brief History

Over the last ten years, expectations for and the needs of our students have dramatically changed (i.e., increased access to technology, expectations for critical thinking, collaboration, CCSS, NGSS, etc.).

During the 2015-2016 school year, Pitman set about creating a culture of learning that would meet the needs of each student.



• Through the PLC process, <u>collaborative teams</u> identify <u>essential standards</u>, create learning <u>targets</u>, and develop <u>common</u> assessments

• Even after all of this work, it is vital to address the diverse needs of students on essential standards, whether they need *intervention* or *enrichment*






• In the spring of 2016, Pitman designed Pride Time

• The Pride Time model provides students an embedded intervention and enrichment time during the school day in order to address specific student needs. The current model is bringing Pitman closer to its mission of "Success for Each Student."





How it works



- This embedded intervention model allows teachers to *identify students* who may need extra time and support learning essential targets
- Collaborative teams determine lab assignments for teachers
- Students choose open labs if not assigned
- Teacher assignment takes <u>priority</u> over student requests
- Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri...Lab Days
- Homeroom once each month, same teacher all 4 years, focus on College/Career Readiness, Character, Expectations, etc.

Examples of intervention / enrichment



- (I) Specific learning target help
- (I) Make-up and Retake labs
- (E) Peer tutoring
- (E) College/career enrichment
- (I) General Study Lab

Enriching Students

- Enriching Students is a web-based scheduling application.
- Students schedule themselves or are scheduled by their teachers for specific support.
- During Pride Time(4th), all students will: receive intervention, review for formative/summative assessment, retake assessments, or attend enrichment courses.
- This model provides <u>extra time</u> for students who need <u>support</u> to demonstrate proficiency with learning targets or <u>need support</u> with academic and social behaviors.

As of February 2019...

- 56 College and Career Readiness Labs offered this year, 1276 students in attendance who have accessed.
- Jessica's House small group for grieving students, 8 week sessions.
- Over 35 high-risk freshman were identified by counselors for academic and behavioral support.
- 2 counselors each semester conduct small group counseling sessions for students struggling with *stress, anxiety, depression,* and *loss* during Pride Time.
- Academic Espionage (cross-curricular Murder Mystery enrichment labs)
