# Candlewood Lake Elementary School

The opening of Candlewood Lake Elementary School will be an exciting and memorable experience for our students, families and faculty.

As you may know, at the October 19, 2022 Board of Education meeting, the Municipal Building Committee (the "MBC") updated the Board on the construction progress of Candlewood Lake Elementary School relative to the targeted January 3rd move-in date for the Huckleberry Hill students & staff. The Municipal Building Committee shared that there have been supply chain issues (especially flooring) and subsequent construction timing issues regarding the finished floors installation that will delay the transition.

On December 14, 2022, the Board of Education will receive an update from the town's construction contractor, O&G, regarding the new construction finishing schedule and its impact for the students and staff to move into CLES. We will continue to keep you updated as we progress towards this exciting time!

The District's Technology Team continues to take proactive approaches to protecting all of our network resources. Recently, the district obtained a Cybersecurity Insurance policy. Some of the factors that led to our ability to obtain such a policy include current capabilities for:

- Multifactor Login Authentication for all staff computers, email, and other resources
- Limited VPN remote network access managed by Technology staff
- Comprehensive Backup and Disaster Recovery Solution
- Necessary Security patches and updates installed as available


# **CABE COMMUNICATIONS AWARD!**

Throughout the fall, our Instructional Coaches have led professional development, organized student assessments, conducted data reviews, collaborated on curriculum revision and writing, worked directly in classrooms with students on specified lessons and units, and presented at Board of Education meetings to help demonstrate some of the wonderful learning experiences that are taking place within the Brookfield Public Schools.

# STRATEGIC PLANNING



Our team of educators, students, parents and Board members has been diligently collaborating for the past three months to help determine the direction of our school system for the next five years.
