 - b. Your "Career":
 - i. Hypothetically pretend you have followed your plans and you have now achieved your dream job. Describe your job. Describe what you are responsible for doing. Where do you work?
 - ii. Description of Career – This section should provide an example of what a typical day in this job look like.
 - iii. Working Conditions – Days of work, hours, dress, indoor or outdoor
 - iv. Skills Needed – The type of skills a person in this career needs. Indicate which of these skills you currently possess and if you don't possess them, what can you do to develop these skills.
 - v. Education – Indicate whether higher education, trade school or other training is needed for the job.
 - vi. Salary –Provide entry level, mid-level and upper level or management scales.
 - vii. Career Outlook – Indicate what the job prospects are for the future. This should include statistics and trends

4. Interview – I will help you find someone to interview. Pick a good person, not a convenient one that is not as applicable.
 - a. Interview a person that has the career you are seeking/considering. This may be an oral, video, or written interview. You should describe this interview in your oral presentation. You may want to include clips or quotes. Be sure to tell the person why you want the interview while you are setting it up.
 - b. Required questions:
 - i. What did/do you think of your experience in the field?
 - ii. What does a typical day look like/how do you spend your time?
 - iii. What would you do if you were me?
 - iv. Suggestions regarding how I can be more likely to get the job I want in this field? Internships, volunteer work, etc?
 - v. Is this where you thought you would end up?
 - vi. If you could do it all again, what would you do differently?
 - vii. What not to do?
 - viii. Other possible jobs/careers with similar major/background?
 - ix. Other certifications, etc would be helpful?
 - x. If a specific question comes up, how can I follow up with you?
 - xi. Who else would you recommend I connect with?
