Chemistry Course Syllabus

Grades will be determined by the following components.

1. Notebooks, Projects, Lessons

- assignments should be neat and organized in a notebook; this includes class work, homework, notes and other class materials
- assignments will be checked daily and notebooks will be graded every 2-3 weeks
- assignments completed on time will earn full credit, assignments completed late will receive no more than half credit
- late work will be accepted for partial credit for 2 days after the due date
- lessons will be posted on class website and should be completed in a timely manner, working ahead is good but falling behind is bad
- worth 20% of overall grade

2. Lab Safety & Participation

- lab must be prepped before the class period in which it will be completed
- all safety practices and procedures followed during the lab
- each lab partner must be on task during the lab
- failure to honor safety rules may result in the dismissal from all future labs
- worth 5% of overall grade

3. Lab Reports

- a full lab report is due the day after the completion of the lab
- lab report must be submitted via google docs/drive
- if a student has an excused absence the day of the lab they have no more than 1
 week to make it up
- worth 20% of overall grade

4 Assessments

- concept quizzes will be administered on a regular basis
- mastery of a concept will be demonstrated on quizzes; once the concept has been mastered twice (a score of 4 on 2 separate quizzes) the student is no longer required to complete questions related to that concept on any quiz
- each concept is worth 5 points when fully mastered
- Worth 45% of overall grade

5. Final Exam

- final exam will be given at the end of each term and is cumulative
- worth 10% of overall grade

Discipline Contract
