Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results

Content Knowledge: The qualifications and requirements for US citizenship, Opportunities for civic participation and engagement at the local, state, and federal level, Basic factual information regarding the chosen course research topic, If the chosen problem is local, state, and/or nationally significant.

Vocabulary: stakeholders, public policy, citizen/citizenship, naturalized, natural-born, civics, civic action

Skills: gather relevant information from multiple sources, analyzing the role of citizens and democracy in the US political system, evaluating social and political systems based on opportunities for civic involvement, determining central ideas or information from sources, Introducing claims, journaling.

Expectation: Students will learn about the citizenship requirements for those becoming naturalized in the US, and will develop a proposal for their Civic Action Plan.
