What are the Common Core State Standards?

The Common Core State Standards are a single set of clear and consistent educational standards that outline what skills students should be learning at each grade level in Math and English/language arts.

What Can Parents Do to Help

- Read a combination of fiction and non-fiction aloud or with your child.
 Look for subjects that interest your child.
- Select more difficult passages over time.
- Read more informational texts including newspapers, magazines, science and social studies books.
- Talk with your child and have him or her explain things.
- Encourage writing at home.
- Help your children know/ memorize basic math facts.
- Discuss and "do" real life math with your children.
- Look for "word problems" in real life.
- Encourage a good work ethic.
- Let your children see your read and "do" math.
- Discuss with your children how they are doing in school and what they are learning.
- Talk about tests with your child and be positive and encouraging.
- Talk with your child's teacher(s) about their performance in school.

- importance of graduating from high school ready for college and career success.

Why do we need new standards?

- Prepares students with the knowledge and the skills they need to succeed in college and work;
- Provides educators, parents and students with clear, focused standards or expectations for what children should know and be able to do when they change grade level or graduate high school;
- Sets consistent expectations;
- Includes both knowledge and the application of subject area skills:
- Builds upon strengths and lessons of current state standards and standards of top-performing nations; and
- They focus upon real-world applications.

What's New for Mathematics?

- <u>Focus</u>: Learn more about fewer key topics
- <u>Coherence</u>: Build skills within and across grades
- Rigor: Develop speed and accuracy in solving equations and word problems
- Really know it, really do it
- Use it in the real world
- Think fast and solve problems

- Students read as much non-fiction (newspaper) as fiction (Dr. Seuss)
- Learn about the world by reading
- Read more challenging material more carefully
- Discuss reading using facts/proof
- Write non-fiction using facts/proof
