What are competitive events?

- Competitions Section, State, and National Leadership Conferences.
 - Test knowledge of business oriented/technical careers
 - Present impromptu/planned speeches.
 - Roleplay with judges.
 - Design your own app, business plan, public service announcement, website, and more.

With 65+ different events, there's one for everybody

Why should I compete?

- Awards, plaques, and bragging rights, great on college apps...
 - Top 10 in each event will receive a plaque/trophy.
 - First place at the State Leadership Conference earns \$\$\$\$\$
 - Help make Centennial #1 in Inland Empire and in California.
 - Looks awesome on your resume



Objective Test Events

- 100 multiple-choice question test to be completed in 60 minutes.
 - Huge variety of topics
 - Accounting
 - Business Communication
 - Computer Problem Solving
 - Health Care Administration
 - Intro to Business
 - Marketing
 - Technology



Speech Events

- Present a 3-5 minute pre-planned or impromptu speech.
 - Introduction to Public Speaking 9th/10th grade only.
 - Creed- Recite the FBLA Creed
 - Public Speaking for ANY grade.
 - Impromptu Speaking Topic is given to you and you have 10 minutes to write speech, then present to judges.

Production Events

- Create a specific project prior to the event
 - Timed one or two hour test, computer-skills required
 - Prompts include database management, word processing, excel spreadsheets, powerpoint
- Events also require a 60 minute, 100 question objective test
- These events may have the fewest competitors, being able to type fast is a major benefit.



"Intro to" Events

- Events for only 7th to 10th grade FBLA members.
 - Simpler concepts
 - Younger members can test in ANY event, older members can't compete in "Intro" events.

How to choose an event?

- Look at the list of events.
- Pick events based on personal interest, relevance to a career you're interested in, relationship with a class you're taking... anything that will make you want to study and learn more.
- Talk with friends about group events you'd want to do together.

How to prepare?

- Look at each event's competencies.
- Find books or websites that cover all or most of the competencies.
- Take notes in the months leading up to conference.
- Attend study sessions or practice your speech with advisers

- Need to be a 2020 National FBLA registered member
 - Pay \$25 to ASB for membership
- Sign up for events on interest sheet for events Before Nov. 15th
 - Guarantee your spot by:
 - Studying and preparing for test-offs
 - Attending meetings designed for each type of event.
 - Earning a qualifying score on a pre-test in some events
- Inland Section Conference is Saturday, February 8th (\$33)
 - There are conflict testing dates before the 8th
