Course Information

Welcome to AP English Language and Composition. This course is designed to help students closely and deeply analyze argument and rhetorical strategies in a variety of genres. Over the course of the year, students will read selections of speeches, essays, articles, poetry, and novels. Students will recognize a variety of rhetorical strategies, including satire, irony, and visual arguments. By the end of the year, students will be able to write several kinds of essays, pulling evidence from a variety of sources. In May, students will take the AP English Language exam, before concluding the academic year with research projects. The course is designed to mimic a college-level Introduction of Writing course, and as such is extremely rigorous and requires students to be responsible for their own work.

Grading

Essays are graded on the AP scale out of 9 points. Essays and assignments are then inputted to the gradebook as follows:

By using this scale, students are not penalized for struggling with the first attempts at writing various types of essays. Moreover, they can see their growth according to the AP scale, preparing them for the test itself. Additionally, students will begin each mode of essay writing with extra time and class-discussion, but will end each unit by completing timed writing tasks on their own. Other assignments will be graded on a completed/incomplete basis.

The course gradebook will be yearlong. Assignments will be weighted as follows:

20% In-Class Tests/Quizzes (including multiple choice tests, and the first semester final exam) 30% Major Papers

20% Homework/Classwork/Participation (including writer's notebook, participation in group and class discussions, close reading assignments, etc.)

15% Summer Homework/Timed Writings15% All other Writing Assignments and Writer's Portfolio

Class Norms

As this is a college-level course, students will be treated as adults. Students are responsible for completing work on time, turning in work appropriately, and checking their grades. Late work will not be accepted, but all work may be revised after a conference with the teacher. Students who are absent from class are responsible for getting and completing any work on their own. Most work will be posted on Aeries and will be available in the classroom for a week.

Plagiarism Policy

Plagiarism is a serious offence; it and cheating will not be tolerated. Students caught cheating or plagiarizing will receive an automatic zero on the assignment and the student's parents will be contacted. Students may have the opportunity to make up the assignment but, depending on circumstances, are not guaranteed a re-write. If a re-write is granted, they must do so under the teacher's supervision and must write a formal apology explaining their choices and why cheating is wrong. In order to prevent cheating and plagiarism, I will be using turnitin.com.
