Definition of Title I:

- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind.
- Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of student receiving free/reduced lunch.
- Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.
- Our schools operate schoolwide program.

Goals of Title I

- Increase academic achievement
- Provide direct instructional support to students
- Provide professional development to teachers
- Promote parent education and involvement

Schoolwide means:

- The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
- Title I funds are used to serve all students in order to raise academic achievement and performance.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting performance targets.

Chap/Vista's Focus Goals

- Provide every student with a personalized educational plan to meet their needs.
- Provide a rigorous curriculum based on the California State Standards and Frameworks school-wide across all subject areas.
- Continue to seek reliable data to close the achievement gap by providing interventions and support to struggling students.
- Promote student achievement by continuing bi-monthly guidance periods to encourage self-monitoring of the Individual Growth Plan (IGP) and alternative academic settings.
