Cyber Security / Cisco-Computer Networking

Cyber Security / Cisco-Computer Networking gives students hands-on applications and Internet driven lessons to gain experience in network design, configura-tion, writing and setup. Each student will design, build, and maintain small to medium-sized networks. The ĆISCO Networking Academy program consists of four semesters of intense networking fundamentals. Students are prepared to continue their education at a four year University, or to enter the workforce.

These courses are dual-credit with Heartland College and prepare students to sit for the Cisco Systems certification exam (CCNA).

The second year of this program consists of Microsoft Server and workstation configuration in a networked environment.

Internship opportunities are available for networking students who decide to pursue networking technologies as a career.

Computer Maintenance and Repair

PC Maintenance & Repair is a two-year program that teaches students strategies for troubleshooting and maintaining personal computers.

The first year, students gain experience working with power supplies, motherboard components, RAM, expansion cards, printers, monitors, networking equipment, and other computer hardware.

The second year gives students knowledge and experience in working with computer software and operating systems.

Students in the advanced program will focus on completing modules designed to assess their skills in PC Fundamentals and PC Support Skills. This course also includes an intense review to assure that students have the skills required to take the A+ Certification Test. Obtaining this certification signifies that a student possesses the technical and customer relations skills essential for a successful service technician.

All students develop a professional portfolio that includes a resume, cover letter, and letters of reference. Interview skills are emphasized, along with an intense section covering career paths and college options. Students participate in internship opportunities with local businesses and schools. These internships allow students to gain hands on experience while building professional portfolios.






