
Eleanor Roosevelt High School is a comprehensive high school in Riverside County, California, with an enrollment at 4,700 students. The school celebrated its ten-year anniversary in 2016. The school's 62-acre campus is nestled in a growing suburban area called Eastvale, in the greater Inland Empire region. The four corners of the school are literally sandwiched between rows of new housing tracks and existing farms and dairies. The 2016-2017 school year welcomed the first class of freshman to the Eastvale STEM Academy; the three-story eSTEM facility opened on the ERHS campus this year.

Over the last ten years, Eleanor Roosevelt High School students have made their mark in various national and state academic award programs such as the National Merit Scholarship Program, the Gates Millennium Scholar program, Girls and Boys State, and the prestigious Questbridge College Matching Program.

In 2017, ERHS partnered with our local community college to offer Dual Enrollment college classes on our high school campus. The course offerings were limited at first, however with each subsequent semester, ERHS is offering more classes in varying subject areas as interest in the program grows. Students are taking full advantage of earning college units while completing their high school requirements; over 300 students are enrolled in the Dual


