Summer Reading 2018 9th Grade Advanced English

Required:

- 1. The Count of Monte Cristo by Alexander Dumas (see assignment below)
 (You must read the Lowell Bair translation, which is abridged.)—
- **2.** Lord of the Flies by William Golding (see assignment below)
- **3**. **An additional book of choice is required.** It may be fiction or non-fiction. Just read and enjoy!

Assignments:

Assignment #1 - When you read *The Count of Monte Cristo*, you must engage in an active reading strategy that reflects more than simply reading the story (marginal notes, annotations, questions at the end of chapters, etc.). You can choose the strategy, but it must reflect engagement with the text. You can trace a character's development throughout the text, or you can develop a study guide. You can trace how multiple themes develop over the course of the text, or you can explore how the historical context contributes to the sinister machinations of Villefort. Whatever the case, you MUST produce, on the VERY FIRST DAY OF CLASS, evidence that you have approached *The Count of Monte Cristo* with the intentions of a scholar.

Assignment #2 - When you read *Lord of the Flies*, YOU MUST COMPLETE THE "SUMMER READING DIALECTICAL JOURNAL" ASSIGNMENT.

WHEN YOU READ YOUR SUMMER READING BOOKS, DO NOT USE ANY EXTRA-TEXTUAL SUMMARIES (*CLIFFS NOTES* OR *SPARK NOTES*, etc.). Success in Ninth Grade Advanced English requires students to do their own processing of these grade-appropriate texts, and remember, movies are poor substitutions for books.

Guidelines for choice books:

- Books that were required reading in previous English classes, and books that you have previously read may not be read for your choice selection; this must be a NEW selection for you!
- You may choose any book for your choice selection, provided it is grade level appropriate. If you would like some book suggestions, you may refer to the lists below; however, it is not mandatory that you choose a book from these lists.
