COURSE DESCRIPTION

In the second level of the Spanish for Native speakers program, the student will study Hispanic history and culture, as well as the political and socio-economic issues facing the Spanish speaking world. The student will be expected to participate orally through debates, presentations, demonstrations, speeches and student lectures. Writing assignments for this course will focus on the advanced paragraph and the three paragraph essay. The differences between formal and informal language, both oral and written, will be stressed throughout the year.

At the end of the semester the students will be able to:

- → Participate effectively in oral and written interpersonal communication.
- → Synthesize information obtained from a variety of resources such as videos, pictures, and audio.
- → Synthesize information from a variety of written and print resources.

- → Develop, create and present spoken and written presentations.
