





In recognition of Women's History Month, author of children and young adult books, Lois Lowry, who was born Lois Ann Hammerberg, is the spotlight author of the month. Lowry, born on March 20, 1937 in Honolulu, Hawaii, always enjoyed reading especially since she was an introverted child. Around the age of 9 she discovered a love for writing and decided at that point she wanted to pursue a career in that field. After graduating high school in New York City she spent two years at Brown University, but dropped out to marry at the age of 19. After having 4 children, she later graduated from the University of Southern Maine in the 1970's.

Shortly after graduating, Lowry's writing career became very successful. Her first novel, A Summer to Die, was published in 1977. This book which was of a serious subject matter of personal loss, was followed by her popular humorous series featuring the character, Anastasia Krupnik. Then in 1989 she won her first Newbery Award for her novel, Number the Stars. Her second Newbery Award was given for her book, The Giver, which eventually was made into a movie in 2014. Other notable books that were published include, Gathering Blue (2000), The Messenger (2004), Son (2012), and the Gooney Bird series in 2011, 2013, and 2014.

Among her many talents, Lowry is a skilled photographer and many of her photographs have graced the covers of her famous literary works. Lowry presently resides in Cambridge, Massachusetts.


