It is at the district's discretion to use this form and, if so, will need consistent guidelines districtwide for what information is outlined in the summary.
Page 3 Prior Written Notice	Prior Written Notice will be a separate document and not part of the new IEP. Format is significantly different.
Page 4 Parent and Student Input	Parent/Student Input will be collected separately for (1) academic achievement and (2) functional performance.
Page 4/5 Present Levels of Performance and Impact Statement	Present Levels information will be collected for <u>each</u> goal area and printed above the annual goals related to the specific goal area.
Page 6 Transition Planning  Student Preferences Transition Assessments PSOGS Course of Study	Minor formatting changes.  A list of previous transition assessments will be included.
Page 6 Transfer of Rights	Includes the requirement for upload of supporting documentation for cases in which parental rights do not transfer.
Page 7 Annual Goals and Short-term Objectives	<ul> <li>Specific template provided for writing goals and objectives will include conditions, measurable/observable skill or behavior, and mastery performance criteria as appropriate.</li> <li>Short-term Objectives will include a shedule for progress monitoring and a "by when" date for the achievement of objectives.</li> <li>Related CT Core Standards (ELA and Math) or ELDS will be required pull-downs for <u>Academic</u> Goals. Page 10 Special Factors Information	This information is included in the Special Considerations section near the beginning of the IEP.
Page 10 Progress Reporting (when issued)	Formatting changes.
Page 10 Exit Criteria	Renamed to Anticipated Exit Criteria.
Page 10 Information on IEPs and Secondary Transition	Included in the resources section of the new IEP; documents will be made available to the parent via the parent portal or can be printed and mailed.
Page 11 Special Education and Related Services Grids	Minor formatting with a revised list of instructional sites.
Page 11 ESY Special Education and Related Services Grids	ESY Services will be documented in a separate service grid.
Page 11 Transportation	Special transportation requirements are separated into three categories.
Page 11 Special Education Hours and Time	More specificity in TWNDP (e.g., a change from Semester 1 to Semester 2) will be provided.
