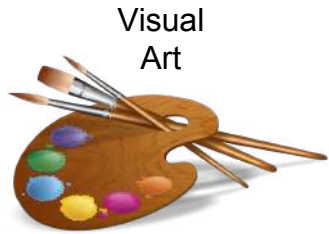

- Television Production 1 and 2 (½ credit each)

These 4 year plans are a sample of options for students who wish to take courses in Media Arts for 4 years.

The guidance counselor will work with students to create a specific plan that meets student interests and scheduling needs.

TV Production Option

Year 1: Studio in Media

Year 2: Electives
(Photography, Computer Graphics, Intro to Theatre)

Year 3: TV Production 1&2

Year 4: TV Broadcasting

*Years 2 and 3 are interchangeable

Year 1: Introduction to Theatre

Dance 2

Advanced dance techniques. Students have the option of taking this for 1 or 2 periods per day.


