May 2017 - Thoughts from the Reading Department



What is the dreaded summer slide?? (Don't take the slide this summer!)

Summer Break is quickly approaching. The "summer slide" is an all-too-common frustration for teachers and parents. Students who don't read during the summer are likely to lose crucial ground. Our students and teachers have worked hard all year to learn new skills and become stronger Readers, Spellers and Writers. Don't be a summer slide victim!

Help prevent your child from the "summer slide" and provide them with opportunities to strengthen skills during the break from school. Here are some suggestions.

- Have your child read 20+ minutes each day. Research proves that reading just 20 minutes each day outside of school can increase a student's vocabulary by almost 2 million words!
- **Set a good example**. When your child sees you reading and enjoying a book, magazine or newspaper, you are sending a message that reading is an important and valuable activity.
- Read with your child. Introduce a variety of book genres and writing styles.
- **Read for different purposes**. Reading a recipe or directions for assembling a toy are fun ways of incorporating reading into everyday activities.
- Make reading and writing a regular part of your daily home activities. If reading isn't
 one of your child's top priorities, consider setting up an incentive program to help them
 stay motivated.
- Talk to your child about what he or she is reading. Ask open-ended questions such as, "what do you think about that story?" or, "What would you have done if you were that character?" to encourage meaningful discussions.
- **Visit your public library**. Most community libraries run summer reading programs to inspire and engage students of all ages.
- **Play word games**. Play games such as thinking of different words to describe the same things.

- Set limits for screen time. Reducing screen time creates opportunities for reading.

- *Kids Book Discussions for grades 4 and up. Thursday evening discussions in July and August. Books are available in June for these discussions (dates and times TBA). The books this summer will be nutmeg nominees Escape From Mr. Lemoncello's Library by Chris Grabenstein, and Spy School by Stuart Gibbs.







Greetings from the Math Lab!

My how quickly the year has gone by! Now that the warm weather is finally here, everyone is beginning to think about summer.

As you know it is important for students to review math concepts and processes over the summer months. According to Cooper's research "most students lose about two months of grade level equivalency in mathematical computation skills over the summer months." Helping students practice and review math skills will help students reinforce prior knowledge, help students reach mastery of required concepts and increase their ability to use facts and operations fluently. Most importantly, summer math should provide opportunities to explore how we use math on a daily basis and provide students with a Chance to have fun with mathematical concepts!

So how can you help? Set up experiences that enable your child to use mathematical thinking and problem solving. Allow students to practice using their math skills in everyday experiences such as when going to the grocery store. Allow students to practice their skills by counting money, comparing prices, etc. Taking a road trip? Pack a deck of cards! There are many games you can play with cards such as Beat That! Players split the deck and flip over their top cards at the same time. Students can practice their multiplication skills (works for addition or subtraction too) by shouting the product first. Whoever, says the correct product keeps both cards.

Be sure to keep practicing those facts! Remember, each grade level has fluency expectations as outlined by the Common Core. Any additional practice with these skills will better prepare your child for school in the fall.

Grade	Required Fluency
Third Grade	Add/Subtract within 1,000 Multiply/Divide within 100 (using strategies) Multiply all products of one digit numbers by end of year (memory)
Fourth Grade	Add/Subtract within 1,000,000 Multiply a whole number of up to four digits by a one digit number Multiply two digit numbers
Fifth Grade	Fluency with multi-digit addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Develop fluency in decimal computations.


