School Hours

Our school hours are 8:50 - 3:20. Students arriving to school after 8:50 will be marked tardy. Any student dropped off after 8:52, must be walked into the building and signed in by a parent or guardian, as T.I.S. staff may not be on outdoor duty past 8:52.

After School Pick up

After School student pick up begins at 3:20. The rear doors to T.I.S. are unlocked at 3:20 for adults to enter the school and proceed to the mini-gym in order to pick up their child. All student pick ups after 3:10 must occur in the mini-gym as the office is incredibly busy with dismissal procedures. If extenuating circumstances, such as injury or illness require office pick-up between 3:10 and 3:25, please call the main office.

In order to avoid the crowd at after school pick up, please consider picking up your child at 3:28, rather than 3:20. After 3:28 there is ample parking and the pick up lines are very small.

Winter Weather

It is important that students come to school dressed appropriately for cold weather. Any student not dressed in long pants and in possession of a coat or heavy sweatshirt, on days in which the temperature or wind chill falls below freezing will be kept inside for that day's recess period.

Art ~ Library ~ Music ~ Physical Education

Ms. Ballard - Art



Third Grade: Do you know the primary or secondary colors? **Color** is just one of the seven **Elements of Art**. In December, the Third graders will be doing a **mixed medium project** with crayons and paint. The students will design a winter scene composition on light blue construction paper using crayons. We will be creating this composition using the **Element of Art** called **Space.** The students will have a **foreground, middleground, and a background** in their composition.

After their crayon composition is completed the students will add white acrylic paint to the scene using a q-tip, thus creating a wintery snow scene.

Fourth Grade: The fourth graders have started working on an Assemblage Sculpture. This Robot Sculpture project has many parts, or rules to follow. The **Assemblage Sculpture** need to be between 8" and 12" tall. It must be "**free standing**." and it must be "**In the Round**." The robot should have **fine details**. The Robot sculpture must have a **Super Power**, and this power must be illustrated in the assemblage design. Lastly, the **Robot Assemblage Sculpture** must be given a **name**. This project will take us into the new year. When we return to school in January, we will finish the assemble sculpture by painting them.



Fifth Grade: These six **Assemblage Sculptures** were made by fifth graders last year. Students will finish their **animal armatures** and start applying the **plaster gauze** in December. After the new year, we will be painting the assemblage sculptures with acrylic paint. Students will start

painting in early January and everyone will be required to wear a smock. Students will be required to follow the grading rubric for this project.

Please, make sure your child has brought a smock to art. Acrylic paint is permanent when it is dry so students should wear old clothes and shoes on art days during the month of January.



Mrs. Hill - Library Media

<u>December is Multicultural Month in the Library Media Center!</u>

We will be celebrating winter holidays around the world.

Multicultural means bringing together **ideas**, **beliefs** or **people** from different countries and cultural backgrounds. When people of different cultures come together to celebrate and share their different traditions this is an example of a multicultural celebration.

Third grade: Students will begin the multicultural unit working on their geo-literacy skills by learning their universal address. Ask your child if they can tell you their universal address, which is: planet **Earth**, the continent of **North America**, the country of the **United States**, the state of **Connecticut**, the town of **Tolland**, then their **street address**. They will also be listening to multicultural winter holiday stories and music as they work on a winter holidays project.

Fourth grade and fifth grade: Students will begin Multicultural Month with a Winter Holidays compare and contrast chart. They will read articles about Christmas, Hanukkah, and Kwanzaa, then answer short questions. Students will end the month by choosing a country to conduct a short research project on. They will collect some basic country facts, but the focus is mainly on the country's winter holiday traditions.

Musical theme for December:

This month, TIS students are learning about **Holidays Around the World**. They will be singing songs and playing instruments from Kwanzaa, Hanukkah, Christmas, Three Kings day and many other winter holidays. **Let's celebrate diversity!**

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> Third graders are singing folk songs from around the world and playing musical instruments to accompany their singing. The students are really enjoying playing the xylophones!!!
