A Message from Principal Dan Bollinger



How time is flying!

Welcome to December and back from Thanksgiving break! I hope the time away was restful and that we'll all enjoy three weeks of health before the end of the semester. That's right... only three weeks left of instruction and only three weeks before grades are submitted.

Some Seniors are finishing early; however, most are about to start their final semester of High School. Understandably, this time of year Seniors get a little anxious, and that may be especially true in the time of Covid. When students start their Senior year, they often say something like, "Finally, it's my Senior year. I can't wait to graduate!" But now it sounds more like, "I am not sure about next year. What am I going to do?" They are asking themselves: What are my passions and strengths? What's my calling? What pays? Am I going to be ready for college? If so, what college? How much will it cost? How am I going to pay for it? How do I apply for financial aid? Do I take a year off? Is the military for me? What will be my career path? Are there programs or apprenticeships for that? While those are good questions for all Juniors to be asking of themselves, some Seniors are still looking for answers.

Parents and guardians, I am sure you can empathize, knowing those questions sometimes persist long after High School. If you're realizing your Senior student is feeling stressed, please remember that your student's school counselor is a critical resource. Always check the counseling section in this Newsletter for information and upcoming events for students and parents. Prior to our transition to remote learning, our counseling staff and College-to-Career liaison had individual conversations with our Seniors to help them navigate next-steps, but please know counselors are still available, now, if your students have questions or need extra support.

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While feeling anxious or stressed may be a sign of the times, often, the way we feel is a choice. The more I think of our country and community's current situation, the more I realize we have a choice in how we react. To be angry or frustrated is a choice. Or living in denial- that's a choice, too. Feeling upset with the governor or our local health department for restrictions put in place... well, that's your choice. But I invite you to consider the benefits of making a different choice. So much good can come from the extra time we have to spend at home, for example. Personally, I'm spending more time with family and exercising. I'm playing cards and board games with my wife and children, and I have even learned to play Pickle ball! Similarly, educators could be consumed with complaint and worry, but, instead, we're learning to adapt and expand our repertoire of teaching tools. In the long run, we will be better teachers and administrators because of this. I'm excited for our eventual return to face-to-face learning and to see how much more effective we will be at staying connected with students who are out with excused absences or who learn best when they see material presented in different ways. So, just as we do in athletics, let's focus on what we control and embrace our 'loses' as true opportunities for growth and new learning.

As mentioned in my last email, over the next three weeks we will continue to take attendance during synchronous learning from 10am-2pm, but students are expected to be working during regular school hours, from 8-3:15pm. Please ask your students how they're budgeting their time. They may need extra encouragement or added accountability in an effort to get organized and stay on top of assignments.

We're also continuing with our call center. In an effort to make sure students are logged on and engaged in their live classes, we are calling home throughout the day on each unexcused absence. If your student has been referred to truancy or is in the process of being referred to truancy for non-attendance, we will remove you from our call list. Again, please note: if students don't demonstrate that they're participating (camera on, answering questions, etc) nor attend for at least 20 minutes, they'll be marked absent.

Finally, if you aren't already accessing Schoology to check your student's progress, please do so as soon as possible. For more information on how to access Schoology, please see the resource posted under announcements on the PHS homepage.

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

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


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Career Focused:

- Be forward thinking. There are so many trade jobs and career opportunities out there, but some require certifications. Research and be prepared, talk to people in the field they want to pursue. 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
