KINDERGARTEN

MRS. RIGGI AND MRS. BAKER

In ELA, our Kindergarteners continue identifying story elements: characters, settings, and events of the story, predicting what will happen next, and creating a mental picture in our mind. Please practice at home having your child ask and answer questions about a text that you have read to them. We are also working on sentences, counting the number of words in a sentence, sentences beginning with an upper-case letter, and ending with punctuation.

We continue to identify, form, and make the sounds of all the letters in the alphabet. Please practice segmenting and blending sounds to make simple CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words. Practice the High Frequency words, and have them read to you nightly.

They love showing-off their skills. Let them show-off as much as possible.

In Math, we will continue connecting written numerals to quantities and classifying objects into categories by counting, using objects, pictures, and numerals. We are working on partners of 6, 7, 8, and 9. The students are using objects to show the different partners.

December is a busy month for all of us, we have many activities planned at school, and we know you do at home, as well. We will try our best to keep it as stress free as possible.

FIRST GRADE

MS. PALMER AND MRS. VARHOLAK

Happy December First Grade Families! The month of December will be filled with many fun activities! We hope you have a wonderful Winter Break!

FUNdations- We will begin Unit 6 which introduces the concept of adding a suffix to a base word. Students will be adding the suffix -s to words in previous units. They will also learn about the concept of plurals and action words, teaching them that when they add the suffix -s, it means more than one or it means something is happening now.

Wonders- We will begin Unit 3. Our big idea is: Changes Over Time- What can happen over time? Each week we will have new essential questions related to the big idea. We will also learn new vocabulary words, high frequency words and read new stories! Please practice high frequency words each night!:)

Math- We will be learning how to solve word problems by adding and subtracting. We will use many strategies such as counting on, doubles, doubles plus 1, and missing addend questions to solve addition and subtraction word problems.

SECOND GRADE

MRS. BOIVIN AND MS. GUERRERA

Hello 2nd Grade Families!!

In December, math will be focusing more on newer topics for second grade. We will begin our second unit in numbers within 100. This will include topics such as addition, subtraction, time and money. We will be using manipulatives to guide us towards strategies. We will be using strategies that we learned in unit 1 also!

In reading, we finished talking about animals and how they can sometimes teach us lessons within stories. We will then move onto Unit 3, which talks about the Earth and people within communities! We will continue using strategies such as: main topic and details and parts of stories.

In fundations, we are going to continue working on vowel teams and their sounds. We will then get more into second grade topics such as multisyllabic spelling and the rules. We will also continue with learning new suffix endings.

The weather is getting very cold, please make sure your child has a coat to go outdoors for recess. Also, if your child needs a sweater while in the building, it must be compliant with the District's Dress Code Policy. Please review the Student Handbook for District Policies including Dress Code Expectations.

For the Holiday Concert, make sure your child is wearing concert attire. They are allowed to wear black, white, red, or green. Only 2 adults are allowed in the concert. Students will be allowed to leave once the concert is over.

We will continue to also reinforce classroom expectations and procedures. Class Dojo communicates to students and to parents how your child is doing in the classroom. Be sure to also check ParentSquare daily for any updates in the classroom!

THIRD GRADE

MRS. CICCONE AND MR. GAGNON

Happy Holidays from Third Grade!

Throughout December in our study of math we will discuss the distributive property of multiplication as well as the commutative and associative properties. We will use our knowledge of multiplication to solve problems and we will begin our study of division.

In literacy we will read expository texts with topics of animal survival, animal and plant adaptations, and problem solving. We will discuss authors' point of view, cause and effect, and problem/solution text structures.

The study of Fundations spelling will introduce students to the very important concept of "vowel consonant e exceptions" and we will teach the "e drop rule" for adding vowel suffixes to "vowel consonant e" words. We will also introduce the new "schwa" sound which teaches students that other vowels can make the short i and the short u sound!

In third grade we continue to emphasize that students should be respectful, on task, accountable, responsible, and safe. We communicate our behavior expectations to students daily through the use of Class Dojo and we encourage parents and guardians to monitor students' behavior along with us each week. We continue to implement end of month rewards for good behavior.

FOURTH GRADE

MRS. CARROLL AND MS. SMITH

In ELA, we have finished up Unit 2 in our Wonders Curriculum which centered around animals and had students ask themselves, "What have you learned from animals or animal characters?" The students are currently typing up a final draft of their explanatory essay on an animal of choice. We are always practicing daily to increase our reading fluency and students should be reading nightly as well in order to increase their reading stamina. They have set a goal of reading at least 4 nights per week for at least 20 minutes each night; and will track this progress on their reading homework calendar.

In Science, we're continuing to learn about waves and how light causes objects to reflect and refract. We will also be learning about how information is transferred.

As the temperatures continue to drop, please make sure to send in proper outerwear with your student (coat, gloves, hat).

FIFTH GRADE

MS. CRESPO AND MR.RUSSO

Hello everyone! Happy December!

The Math goal for December is to finally finish our first Unit and begin exploring Unit 2: Decimals and Fractions. The students have done an excellent job working very hard in Unit 1, so I think they are more than ready to take the next step in adding and subtracting fractions and decimals, and diving deeper into place value!

As far as Science is concerned, we are just finishing up Unit 2 and will start to explore Unit 3: Energy and Matter in Organisms. The students did a wonderful job working together to discuss and critically think about matter, particles, physical and chemical changes, and more during Unit 1. I am very excited to listen to new ideas and have plenty of interesting scientific discussions!

In our ELA section, the students are working on folktales, and now poetry. Students have been doing a great job brainstorming ideas for a poem of their own which will be included in their writer's notebook.

This month has been full of fun and excitement thanks to the awesome staff at STARBASE. The students are having a blast learning more about occupations in the STEM field as well as participating in cool hands-on activities such as controlling robots, creating egg protectors, building functioning circuits, solving puzzles (ask about the Green Glass Door!), and so much more! A special thanks to Diana Toro (LYRA) and the STARBASE team for giving us this opportunity to learn and experiment with them!

SIXTH GRADE

MR. CAROSELLA AND MS.GRIFFIN

Math:

Students will continue with representing ratios and rates using a table or graph. Students will make tables of two quantities and create equivalent ratios to answer word problems. Also, students will take the data from ratio tables to graph onto a coordinate plane. Then, students will use ratio reasoning to convert between measurement systems. Students will manipulate and transform measurements using multiplication and division.

Social Studies:

Students will continue to explore the continent of Asia. Specifically, students will learn about the physical geography, history and life in Southeast Asia.

Reading:

Students will begin the novel study Freedom Walkers: The Story of the Montgomery Bus Boycott exploring the essential qualities of leadership and the characteristics and qualities that make for an inspiring leader. Specifically, students will focus on central/main idea and summarizing throughout this unit.

Language Arts:

Students will continue to work on a variety of grammar skills with a focus on identifying different parts of speech, as well as key transition words between paragraphs.

Science:

Students will continue Unit 2 Ecosystems. Students will research information about biotic and abiotic factors in an ecosystem. Students will discover the importance of abiotic factors as well as identifying the types of biotic factors that maintain a healthy ecosystem. Students will identify and determine the role of producers, consumers and decomposers in an ecosystem.

SEVENTH & EIGHTH GRADE

MR. THOMAS

7th grade -

Students will be studying the Western portion of the United States and are currently completely a digital poster about Death Valley.

8th grade -

Students will begin studying about the French and Indian War. We will examine the precursors that lead to the American Revolution.

8th grade -Students will be working on their Argumentative style writing.


ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE
