December 2019 Responsibility

Teaching responsibility for children is a shared task between parents and teachers. Last year, I discussed teaching children responsibility at home. Some of the activities that help children develop responsibility include chores, modeling responsible behavior, and having a pet. While teaching this type of responsibility seems straight forward, teaching children to accept responsibility for their actions is more complex. One of the first steps is to help children connect the dots between cause and effect. Parents can model this by using examples from their own lives and make it into a game where a parent says a cause and the child comes up with the effect.

Another tool is for us adults to keep cool when expressing our dissatisfaction about poor behavior. It is important that children know that everyone makes mistakes and that telling the truth is more important. If a child is afraid that the adults in their life will become enraged when they tell them the truth, they will avoid telling the truth. Sticking to the rules and being consistent is important. If a child can get away with arguing, being charming, or pleading to persuade you not to enforce a consequence they learn that they do not have to take rules seriously. In order to be accountable children need to learn to accept the consequences of

their words, actions and decisions. This will only happen if the adults in their lives are consistent with rules and consequences.

For children who continually blame others, it is important to help them keep track of how often they blame others. This can be done with a dry erase board on the fridge. The adult can track the number of times they blame another for their actions. If the child can make it under a certain number or beat their record from the previous day, or week, they can earn some incentive. This will help the child to replace the unwanted behavior of blaming others with the wanted behavior of being honest and accepting responsibility. Whenever we want to replace a behavior it is important to praise the child when they are demonstrating the appropriate behavior.

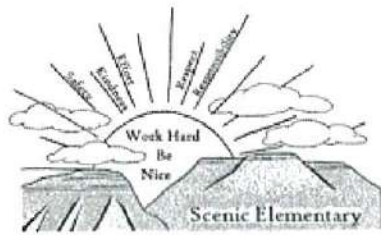
