
- Admission Area: All of California. We are NOT IMPACTED!

 - Be a HS graduate, Complete GED or California High School Proficiency Exam
 - o Qualifiable Eligibility Index
 - o Meet "a-g" Requirements

Impacted Majors with additional requirements:

- Students interested in Business and Nursing Majors are first admitted to CSUEB as a Pre-Business or Pre-Nursing and must additionally apply directly to the Business Administration B.S./Nursing B.S. major by the departmental deadlines. Nursing students are only accepted in the Fall Quarter.
