Additional experiences to augment coursework:

- Join DECA
- Use the self-assessment tools (Career Cluster Finder, My Personality Type, Career Interest Profiler) in Naviance to research various careers and majors and begin to build a list of potential careers.
- Use the Careers tab in Naviance to research potential careers and majors including informational interviews with professionals in the field, knowledge and skills needed to be successful, tasks and activities involved in the work, related careers, average wages by state and other current labor market data.
- Use the Career Exploration Breakfast to begin to learn more about careers of interest.
- Use the Job Shadow Day to get a more in depth view of what a day in the life of a professional in the field looks like.
- Research summer programs or part-time volunteer or paid work opportunities to gain real world experience.
- Go to the website for the professional organization that supports people in this career to learn more about career pathways and professional development opportunities.
- Plan a Senior Capstone experience where you can immerse yourself in the world of work to confirm that this is indeed the path you wish to take.
