### **Description of Course:**

The high school Economics course is a **required** course. Every senior must successfully pass the course to fulfill their graduation requirement set forth by the State of California. Students will be learning basic economic questions like "what a country produces and why?" to "how does the United States economy functions?" In this course, students will study basic economic principles of microeconomics and macroeconomics, international economics, measurement, methods, and comparative economics systems. Students will also learn the real-world functions of economics and how the semester long course will have an impact on them as soon as they graduate high school.

### **Economic Goals:**

Students will achieve mastery at least 60% of standards on all quizzes, tests, midterms, and finals. Students will complete 100% of their class work/homework. Students will be confident speakers, good listeners, conscientious citizens, and supportive classmates.

# Entering The Class Procedure
