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

Course Levels

- Advanced Placement
 - Honors
 - Academic
- General (not offered for Social Studies)
 - Basic



Course Load Requirements

- Minimum of 6.5 credits per year
- Recommend 7 credits per year
- Maximum of 8 credits per year
 - 1 credit = 1 full yr. course
 - .5 credit = $\frac{1}{2}$ yr. course
 - 2 credits = full yr. course meets every day
 - 1.5 credits= full yr. course with lab

Prerequisite - a course you must take before taking another course (ex. Art foundations before Art Studio)

Choosing Your Electives

- Students have/will complete interest inventories in Naviance to identify possible career paths.
- Possible future careers and interests should be taken into consideration when choosing electives.



Course Registration in Powerschool

All incoming 9th grade students will register for their 2016-2017 courses in Powerschool. The **online** student registration period is:

February 20 to March 1, 2016.

Daily Schedule at Sheehan

- A/B block schedule
 - 4 classes per day
- Classes are 84 min. long
 - •5 min. of passing time
 - Start time: 7:30am
 - •End time: 1:55pm
- 2 lunch waves scheduled into 3rd period
 - Advisory meets on Fridays

NCAA Eligibility

- For Division 1 or 2 sport in college, you need to qualify with the NCAA Clearinghouse. (register junior year)
- To qualify, students must take classes at the Academic level or higher.
- Visit the NCAA Clearinghouse website to see a list of Sheehan's approved courses.

Community Service

- 30 hours of Community Service must be completed by May 1st of Senior year
- Can be started the summer before 9th grade
- Forms and suggested locations are available in Sheehan School Counseling Office
