For the first few weeks, we will begin with mastering classroom policies and procedures, while covering the required summer reading texts. Each nine weeks, instruction and standards will be rooted in the thematic concepts of a novel and accompanying short stories. Writing, speaking, listening, vocabulary, and grammar will supplement these texts. While students in Language Arts classes are not required to provide their own texts, it is encouraged for students to purchase their own copies of novels for reading, re-reading, notes, annotation, and other activities.
