### GRADING, GPA, & RANK

- Grades are reported every 9 weeks.
- A semester course is 18 weeks long. Each quarter comprises 50% of the total grade.
- A full-year course is 36 weeks long. Each quarter comprises 25% of the total grade.
- There are no midterm or final exams for any courses.
- GPA is based on final grades in all BHS courses. Courses taken as Pass/No Pass are not included.
- Decile rank is reported for seniors based on the six-semester weighted GPA and is only reported for students who have completed 3 semesters at BHS.

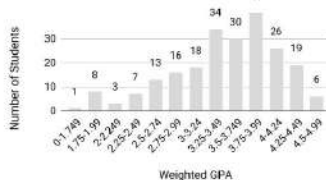

### SPRING 2020 GRADING CHANGES

On March 13, 2020, Brookfield High School closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 23, 2020, students began distance learning using an asynchronous model where they accessed lessons and assignments online and completed work independently, with access to teachers via email or virtual office hours. For the fourth marking period, students could elect a numeric grade or a Pass/No Pass/Pass with Distinction mark, which translated to a numeric grade. The final grade for year-long classes was calculated based on these weightings: Q1 = 25%, Q2 = 25%, Midterm = 10%, Q3 = 25%, Q4 = 15%. The final grade for semester-long classes during the second semester was calculated based on these weightings: Q3 = 75%, Q4 = 25%. No final exams were given in spring of 2020. The final grades for all classes factored into GPA.

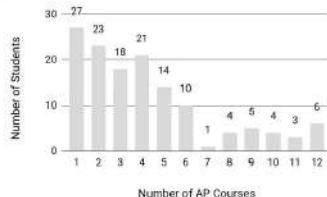
