## CENTRALIA SCHOOL DISTRICT STATE PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS

Centralia School District offers State Preschool programs at Centralia, Danbrook, and San Marino Elementary Schools.

Centralia School District's State Preschool Centers provide carefully planned learning environments conducive to children's learning. Children are provided opportunities to achieve the motor, sensory, language, and intellectual development needed to ensure academic success in elementary school. Particular emphasis is placed on opportunities for the children to acquire oral language skills.

### ACTIVITIES

State Preschool activities are developmentally appropriate and include:

- Opportunities to develop social skills
- Zoo-phonics
- Houghton-Mifflin-Pre-K Curriculum
- Oral Language & Listening Skills
- Large Motor Skills
- Exposure to Science Concepts
- Nutrition Activities
- Field Trips
- Interest Centers
- Arts & Crafts

### STAFF

Centralia School District administers the State Preschool Programs. Staff members have properly qualified early childhood educators chosen for their knowledge of child development, expertise in working with children, and their ability to communicate in English and Spanish.

## PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Parent participation is possible in several ways. Parents wishing to volunteer to work in the classroom to assist with the preparation of materials, assist with the supervision of children in the classroom, and field trips must have a current TB test on file.

Parent Meetings and Parent Workshops are scheduled throughout the year and cover a variety of topics, including:

- Nutrition and Your Child
- Dental Care for Children
- Behavior & Discipline Techniques
- STEAM Workshops
- How to Read to Your Child
- Exercise and Your Child
- How to Help Your Child Prepare for Kindergarten

Parents are expected to attend two Parent-Teacher Conferences yearly to discuss their child's progress.

Parents may also choose to serve on the Parent Advisory Committee, which provides parents an opportunity to help guide the program and effect changes.



## ADMISSIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Enrollment in the State Preschool Program is open to any eligible family. It is operated in accordance with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act and with the U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, which prohibits discrimination based on race, color, sex, age, handicap, religion, or national origin.

Eligibility is determined by current State Department of Education regulations, based on family size and income. Also, Families living within the Centralia and Danbrook boundaries are eligible regardless of income. Once families have established that they meet the economic eligibility criteria, children are given an enrollment priority and a ranking number and are placed on a waiting list. All preschool openings are filled from this list.

Enrollment is open to eligible three to five-year-old children. However, priority is given to those children who are or will be four years of age by September 1st and who have met the economic needs criteria.

### HOLIDAYS

State Preschool Programs follow the school calendar and are CLOSED to observe the same holidays that the schools.

Centers may also be closed for teacher-planning days each year.
