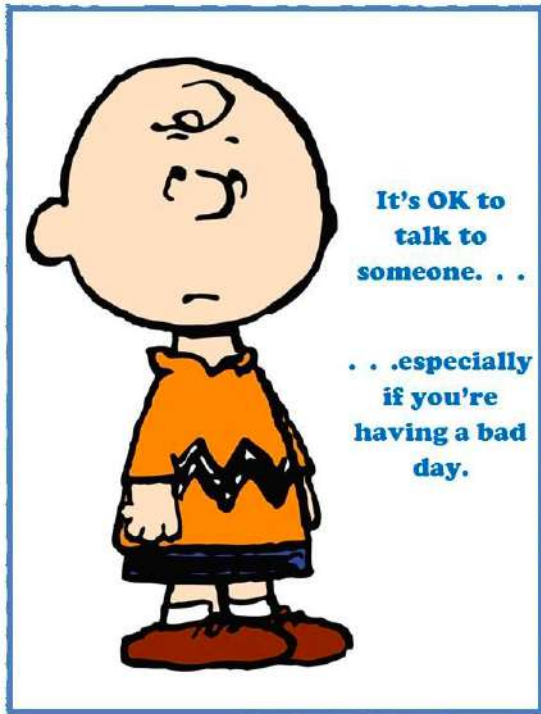

- Teen Parents

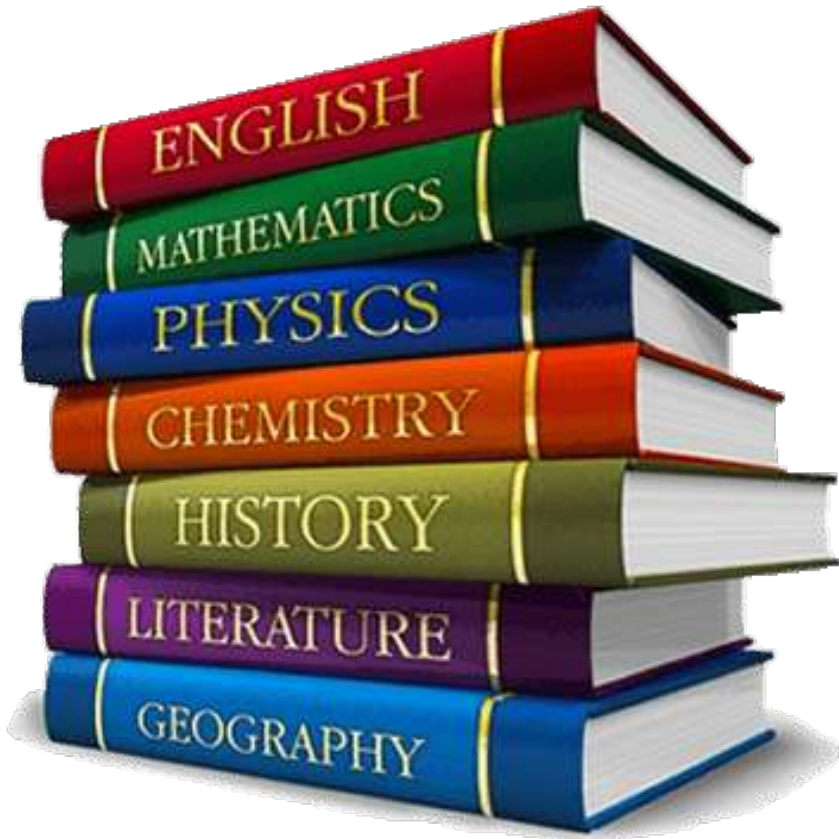

Graduation Requirements

- ✓ Pass all required courses
- ✓ Complete a minimum of 220 credits

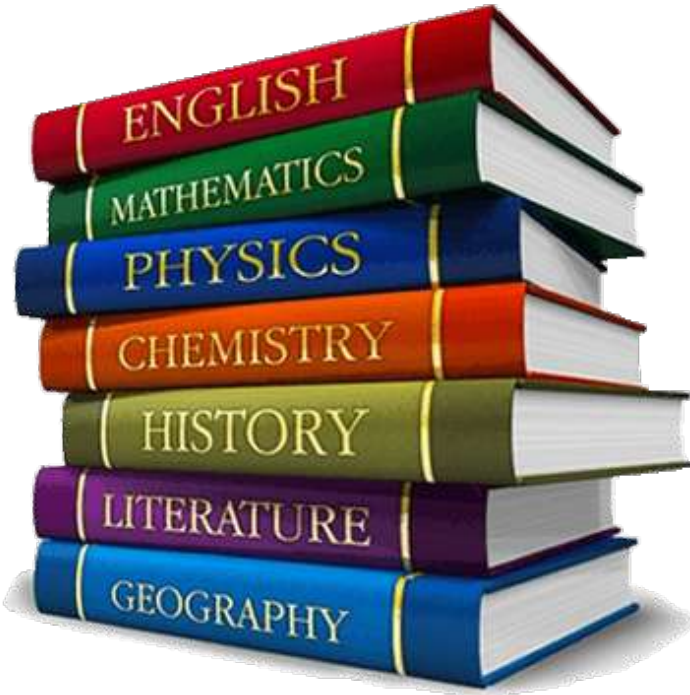


How do I earn credits?



- ▶ You need credits in order to graduate
- ▶ You earn 5 credits for each PASSED class
- ▶ You will take 6 classes each semester
- ▶ $6 \text{ classes} \times 5 \text{ credits} = 30 \text{ credits for 1 semester}$
- ▶ There are 2 semesters in a year
- ▶ **Earn 60 credits in 1 year**

To graduate you must have the required coursework of:



- Language Arts 4 Years
- History/Social Science 3 Years
- Science (Life Sci & Physical Sci) 2 Years
- Math 2 Years
- Physical Education (PE) 2 Years
- Fine arts **or** Foreign Language 1 Year
- Health 1 Semester (5 semester credits)
- 75 Elective credits

= **220** credits total

A, B, C, & D's are passing grades. F's are NOT passing grades, MUST retake the class

A- G REQUIREMENTS

For UC/CSU Admissions

Grades **MUST** be "C" or better

a = History/Social Science - 2 years

b = English - 4 years

c = Mathematics- 3 years required, 4 years rec.

d = Laboratory Science - 2 years required, 3 years rec.

e = Language other than English- 2 years required, 3 years rec.

f = Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) -1 year required

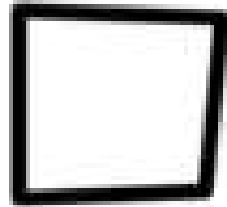
g = College Preparatory Electives - 1 year required



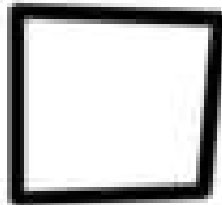
It is similar to our graduation requirements - Need to take at least another year of math and science, along with 2 or 3 years of foreign language.

- Complete each task in that order



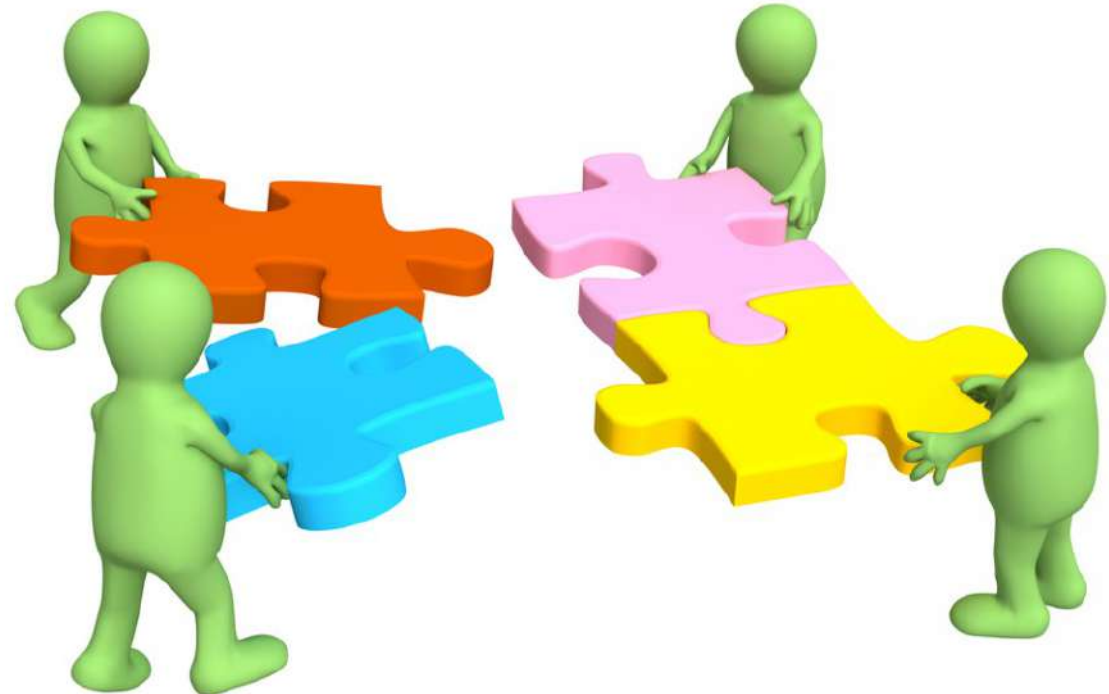
Balance Your Time
