### Spring

- > Register for SAT/ACT
- Sign up for Summer School, Adult School, Credit Recovery, Mt. SAC H.S. Referral Program, ROP (if needed).

### Summer

- > Plan college visits

- > Attend credit recovery program (see above)

### September

- Athletes should register with the NCAA clearing house if you plan to play Div 1 or 2 sports: <a href="https://web1.ncaa.org/eligibilitycenter/common/">https://web1.ncaa.org/eligibilitycenter/common/</a>.
- Review your schedule and transcript. Be sure you have a strong, challenging senior schedule.
- Plan visits to colleges if you did not do this during the summer.
- Narrow your list of colleges you plan to apply to. A reasonable number includes "reach" schools (more difficult for you to get into in), "safe" schools (you meet their requirements) and both public and private universities.
- Visit all college websites and review application deadlines and requirements (testing, recommendation letters, and essays).
- Ask counselors and/or teachers for recommendation letters (if needed). Give two weeks notice at a minimum. Provide self addressed and stamped envelopes.
- Visit the College & Career Center to inquire about college representative visits.
- Review the monthly Scholarship Bulletin (Career Center, Classrooms, Counseling).
- Register to take the SAT and/or ACT again if you need a higher score for your college choices. Deadline is October through December for most colleges.
- Make an appointment with your counselor to review your college options and to obtain college application fee waivers (if you qualify).
- Visit the FAFSA website and obtain your PIN: www.fafsa.ed.gov and www.fafsa.pin.ed.gov.

### October

- Begin FAFSA application and submit
- Attend Financial Aid Night

- Begin CSU applications.
- Concerned about grades? Ask your teachers for help.
- Be sure to send SAT/ACT scores to all colleges you will apply to.
- Review the monthly Scholarship Bulletin (Career Center, Classrooms, Counseling).
- Visit the College & Career Center to inquire about college representative visits.
- Check the Counseling website for new updates.
- Check the ETS calendar for college application workshops.

### November

- Begin UC applications/private college applications. Finalize your essays.
- Register for the CSS Profile if any college to which you are applying requires it: www.profileonline.collegeboard.com.

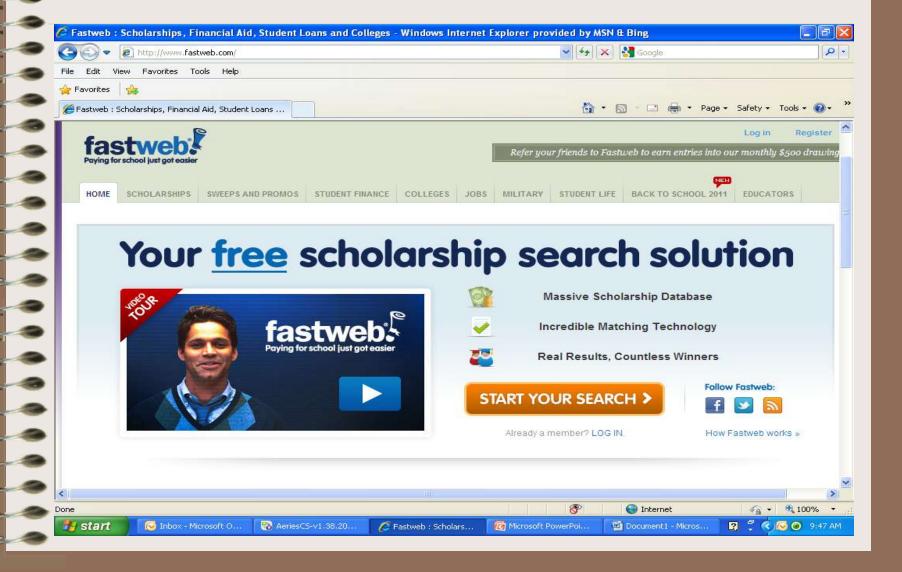

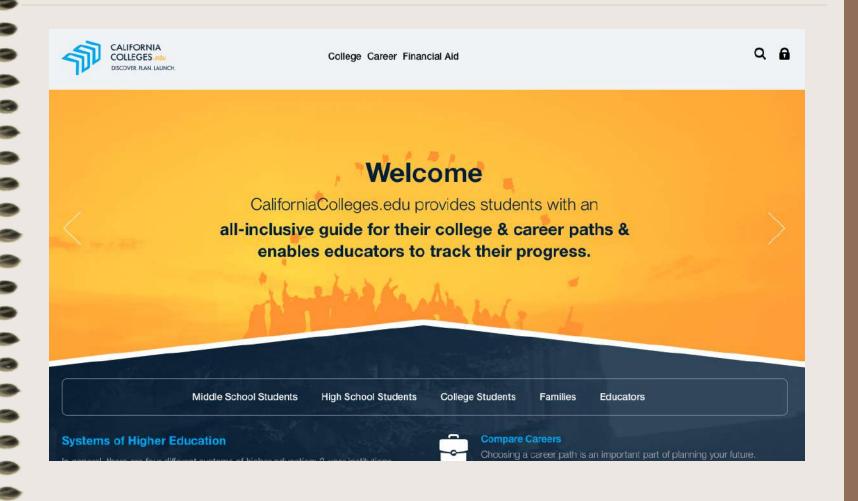

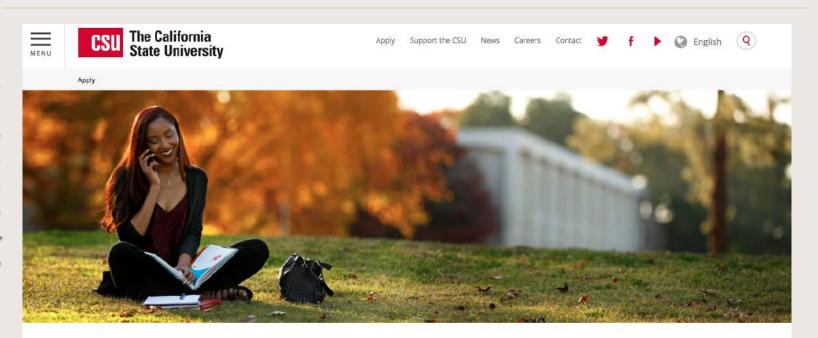

- IF YOU QUALIFY FOR A FEE WAIVER, YOU MUST FILL OUT A SPECIAL BLUE FEE WAIVER FORM FOR THE SAT SCHOOL DAY! SEE YOUR COUNSELOR!

### **CSU Admissions**

- Application window opens October 1, 2017
- Only one application is needed even if you are applying to multiple campuses - applications are sent to each campus
- The minimum required GPA for admission eligibility is a 2.0 the lower the GPA, the higher the test scores must be (SAT Reasoning test or ACT)
- SAT Subject tests are not required
- The application fee is \$55 fee waivers are available online
- GPA is based on grades earned during the sophomore and junior years of high school (a-g approved courses only)
- Up to eight semesters of honors courses taken in the last two years of high school will be granted additional points

### **UC Admissions**

- Only the grades you earn in "A-G" subjects in the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11th are used to calculate your GPA.
- 9th grade courses can be used to meet the Subject Requirement if you earn a grade of C or better...however, these grades will not be used to calculate your GPA.
- UC's assign extra points for up to four units of UC-certified honors level and advanced placement courses taken in the last three years of high school.

A=5 points, B=4 points, C=3 points

- No more than two years of UC-approved honors level courses taken in the tenth grade may be given extra points.
- A grade of D in an honors or advanced placement course does not earn extra points.
- Students admitted to UC share a high level of academic ability and potential.
  Most students rank in the top 12.5 percent of high school graduates. The
  majority of students are from California. The number of applicants often
  exceeds the spaces available for a particular campus or major. Therefore,
  meeting the minimum admissions requirements is not enough to gain
  admission to many UC campuses and programs.

### **UC Admissions**

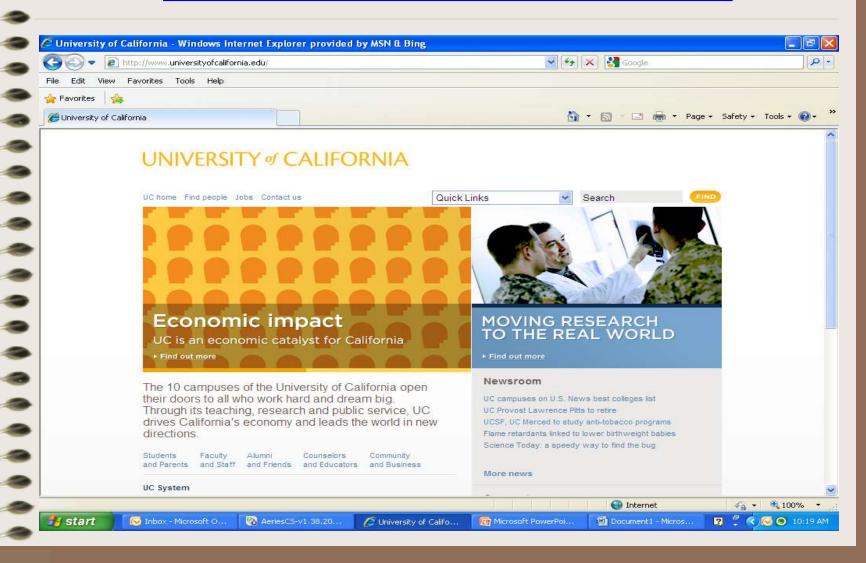
- Students must submit the following test scores:
  - SAT Reasoning or ACT
    - · the best scores will be taken into account
    - the ACT composite score must be submitted.
  - SAT Subject Tests no longer required
- Writing Prompts/Personal Insight Questions: Each new question aligns to one or more of the 14 comprehensive review factors that campuses consider in their admissions decisions.
- Freshmen must choose 4 out of 8 questions
- Maximum of 350 words for each response
- All questions have equal value; there is no advantage or disadvantage to choosing certain questions over others
- Complete one application for all campuses.
- Admissions criteria based largely on GPA and test scores.
- The minimum required GPA varies by campus/program.
- All testing (SAT, ACT) must be done by the end of December.
- The application fee is \$70 fee waivers available.

### WHAT IS EOP/Educational Opportunity Program

- -Provides orientation sessions campus services, academic assistance and programs to help students learn about CSU/UC requirements and programs
- Provides tutoring, advising and specialized retention services
- Provides transitional support such as the Summer Bridge Program
- Awards EOP grant to eligible Students
- •The application for EOP is imbedded in the college application
- •The deadline to apply is January 15th

AVAILABLE ON CSU and UC CAMPUSES

Provides academic support and retention services to first-generation, historically low income and educationally disadvantaged students

- Targets students who have the potential to perform satisfactorily in the CSU/UC but have not been able to realize this potential because of economic or educational background
- Provides admission, academic, and financial assistance to accommodate the needs of the individual campus student population
- Tailors its programs to accommodate the needs of the individual campus student population

### Who Should Apply for EOP?

Historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged undergraduate students who need admission assistance and support services to succeed in college

Students who demonstrate academic potential and motivation

California residents and students who qualify for AB 540 nonresident tuition exemption

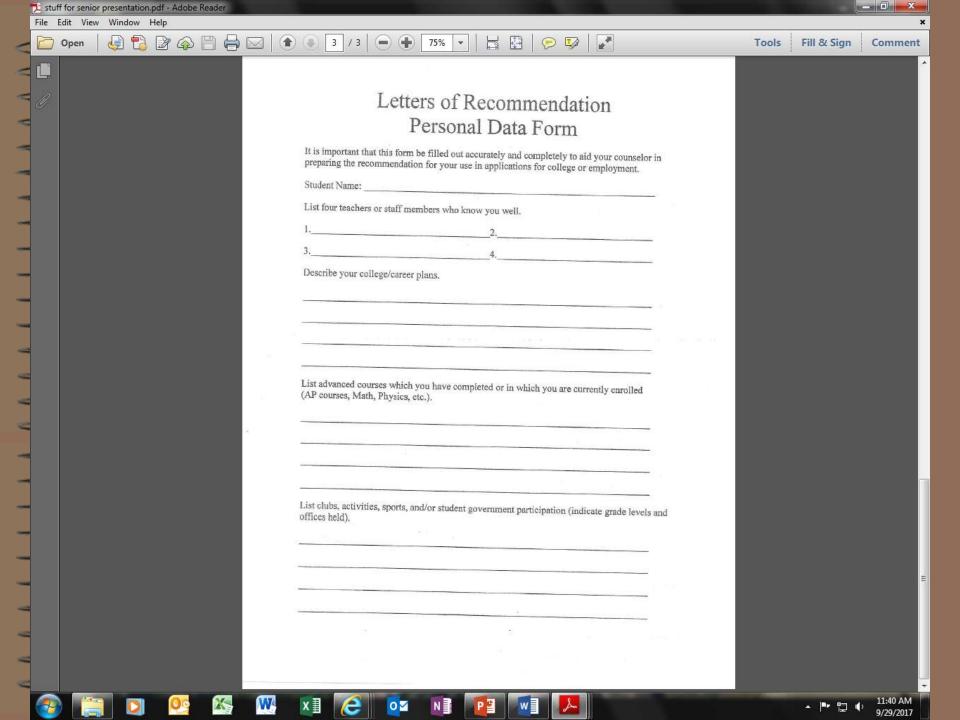
### **Private Colleges**

- 76+ campuses in California, each with a unique focus: liberal arts colleges, major research universities, comprehensive universities, church- and faithrelated institutions, historically black colleges and universities, single-sex institutions, two-year colleges, and schools of law, medicine, engineering, art, business, and other professions.
- **Professors** *not teaching assistants* teach courses.
- Private schools tend to have a more **personal approach** to education. The admissions policies at private schools are also more personal, looking to student promise, talent. Private school application **deadlines** are not uniform.
- Tuition and fees can be in excess of \$30,000 a year however, roughly 8 out of 10 students who attend private schools receive some forms of financial aid! Need-based and/or academic merit!

- Applications for most private universities can be submitted through **send.edu.org** and **www.commonapp.com.**
- Students should create their accounts through send.edu or commonapp.org and include their teachers' and counselors' emails so that all recommendations, transcripts and other documents can be electronically submitted on their behalf.

### **Tips**

- BE FLEXIBLE... The level of competition for admission to many campuses and programs can be quite high, so please consider the following:
  - apply to more than one campus
  - apply to programs that, while not your first choice, will allow you to fulfill your educational goals
- Meet all application deadlines
- Proofread your application for misspellings and grammatical errors
- Be sure to hit the "submit" button
- Do not omit required signatures
- Read directions carefully
- Do not list extracurricular activities that aren't legitimate
- Inform your school counselor where you have applied
- Use a tasteful e-mail address that you will check often

### **Important Senior Reminders**

- Testing for SAT Reasoning and ACT must be completed by the end of December, however, verify each university's deadline. Go online to www.collegeboard.com and http://www.actstudent.org/
- UC applications November 1<sup>st</sup> 30<sup>th</sup>
- CSU applications October 1<sup>st</sup> November 30<sup>th</sup>
- Complete your resume and ask for letters of recommendation early; letters of recommendation are NOT a part of the UC or CSU application
- Attend our FAFSA night in October
- Dream Act presenations TBA on dates
