## **Puritanism**

#### Puritans:

 Want to totally reform (purify) the Church of England away from Catholic traditions

Predestination: God had already chosen those that would be saved

- Good works could not save those predestined for hell
- Believed there were signs in life of your spiritual status





## **Separatists**

#### Extreme Puritans

Church Membership should only be given to the "elect" (those that were "saved")

Thought they were forced to share churches with the "damned"

Therefore, they believed in a total break from the Church of England

## **Migration**

Puritans hoped to reform from within – initially wanted to stay in England Separatists (a.k.a. Pilgrims) decided to leave England

- Initially went to Holland (1608)
- Feared children were becoming "Dutch" not English
- Decided to go to Virginia



# B. The Flight of the Mayflower



## **The Journey**

1620 → Separatists leave England to settle in VA
Only half were Separatists
102 people arrived in Plymouth Bay (MA) in November 1620

 Mixture of men, women, and children

VA Company had no control over them or their land

Had to establish their own government



## The Mayflower Compact November 11, 1620

In I name of god Amen. He whole names are underwriten. The loyal subjects of our dread Sourraigne Lord Hing Tames by I grace of god, of great Britaine, franc, c Freland King defender of Jaith, cr

Haucing underfakin, for y glorio of cod, and advancements of j'aristian and honour of our king c countrie, a royato to plant y first colonie my northerno parts of Virginia. Doly thele prefents solemnly c mutualy my prefence of God, and one of another, cournant, c combine our felues togeather moa civil body politick; for bodor ordering c prefervation c turtherance of y ends afordaid; and by vertue hear to to Enacte, constitute, and frame shuth just c equal lames, ordinances, Acts, constitutions, c offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meete c convenient for g general good of y colonie: Into mhich me promiso all due submission and obsidence. In mitnes where of me have here under subscribed our names at Cap= codd y . 11. of november my year of y raigne of our soveraigno lord king James of cogland, france, c greland f eighteens and of scolland y fifts fourth, Ani dom. 1620]




Written and signed before the Mayflower passengers disembarked from the ship.

Not a constitution, but an agreement to form a govt. and submit to majority rule.

- Signed by 41 adult males.
- 1st written frame of govt. in U.S.
- Led to adult males meeting in assemblies to make laws

## C. The Establishment of the Plymouth Colony



#### That First Year.... Area was recently abandoned by Native Americans

Landed too late in the year to move off of the ship

Winter of 1620-1621

- Only 50 out of the original 102 survived.
- Spring 1621: Created an alliance with Chief Massasoit of Wampanoag Tribe
  - None chose to leave in 1621 when the Mayflower sailed back to England.
  - Began to build a permanent community with the assistance of Squanto

## That First Year.... October 1621 → First "Thanksgiving"

More a harvest festival


## **William Bradford**

### **Plymouth Colony**

- Chosen governor of Plymouth 30 times in yearly elections
- Maintained alliance with Chief Massasoit
- More ships will eventually bring more colonists to the area
- Religion was central to daily life

#### In the end... Plymouth stayed small and economically unimportant.

#### 1691 → only 7,000 people

## The MA Bay Colony

 $1629 \rightarrow$  Puritans got a royal charter to form the MA Bay Company


- Wanted to escape attacks by conservatives in the Church of England.
- They didn't want to leave the Church, just its "impurities."
- 1630  $\rightarrow$  1,000 people set off in 11 ships
- Established a colony with Boston as its hub
  - "Great Migration" of the 1630s
  - Turmoil in England sent about 70,000 people to Americas.
    - 20,000 were Puritan and went to MA

## **John Winthrop**

Became 1<sup>st</sup> governor of Massachusetts.

 Served as governor or deputy-governor for 19 years.

Believed they had a covenant with God We shall be as a city on a hill...



## Characteristics of MA Bay Colony

- Most people arrived in families desiring a permanent settlement
- Government and Church were tied together called "Bible Commonwealth"
  - Organized the colony in self-governing towns
  - Communities formed covenants to work together
- Elected their own governor





### Characteristics of MA Bay Colony Hierarchical and Patriarchal Society

- Low mortality  $\rightarrow$  average life expectancy was 70 years of age.
- Large and extended families
- Population increased dramatically
  - Education had high value
    - 1636 Harvard established
    - MA School Law of 1642 Any community with more than 50, had to establish schools

 Dissenters exiled & establish RI and CT


1692 Salem Witch Trials

## **Puritans vs. Native Americans**


- Culture differences led to clashes
- Natives did not have an alliance and will work against one another
- 1637 Pequot War natives defeated



## King Philip's War (1675-1676)

- Natives feared their culture was being subverted
- Want to halt British expansion
- Metacom (King Philip to white settlers)
- Massasoit's son united Natives (Wampanoags, Nipmucks, & Narragansetts)
  - Staged coordinated attacks on white settlements throughout New England
  - 10% of male population killed or captured
  - Frontier settlements forced to retreat to Boston.





#### The war ended in failure for the Indians

- Metacom beheaded and drawn and quartered
- Many sold into slavery in Caribbean
- Native Americans never a serious threat in New England again
