2022/23 AP Exam Fees

- \$72 per AP Exam
- \$0 for each AP Exam ordered in which a student is eligible for a fee reduction
- \$40 fee for late-order, late-cancellation, or unused exam (This fee is per exam, in addition to the base exam fee. Fee reduction eligibility cannot be applied to this fee.)
- \$40 late testing fee (This fee is per exam, in addition to base exam fee as applicable for alternate exams for late testing. Most reasons for late testing don't incur an additional late-testing fee. Please ask Mr. Fletcher, AP Coordinator, for more information.)

Ordering Deadlines

- November 8, 2022: For full-year and first semester courses
- March 8, 2023: Final deadline for late AP exam orders

AP Exams ordered or canceled after November 8th but prior to March 8th will incur the \$40 late-order fee. Orders cannot be placed after March 8th. If there is any foreseen conflict with an exam date, such as a sporting event or other school activity, please contact Mr. Fletcher, AP Coordinator, to see if there is a late testing option and whether or not the late testing fee can be waived.

Fee Reduction Qualification

In order to be eligible for the fee reduction, the student must meet one of the criteria listed on the "AP Exam Fee Waiver Form" which the parent or guardian needs to initial and sign (see page 3)

Ordering Process

Students *must* complete two steps to order AP exams:

- (1) The student must turn in this AP Exam Registration Form along with appropriate payment (or signed AP Exam Fee Waiver Form) to Andrea Murdoch, EPHS Bookkeeper.
- (2) The student must be enrolled in the AP course section of the College Board. To join their AP section, the student must (1) already have a College Board account and (2) login to myap.collegeboard.org and enter the join code they received from their AP teacher.

Please be aware: Any student who has not submitted payment to the school prior to the ordering deadline will not have an exam ordered.

- Schools must begin the morning exam administration between 8 and 9 a.m. local time and the afternoon exam administration between 12 and 1 p.m. local time. The AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism Exam must begin between 2 and 3 p.m. local time. Schools in Alaska must begin the morning exam administration between 7 and 8 a.m. local time and the afternoon exam administration between 11 a.m. and 12 p.m. local time. The AP Physics C: Electricity and Magnetism Exam in Alaska must begin between 1 and 2 p.m. local time.
- AP coordinators are responsible for notifying students when and where to report for the exams. Early testing or testing at times other than those published by College Board is not permitted under any circumstances.
- AP coordinators should order late-testing exams for students who would like to take exams that are scheduled for the same time.
- AP Seminar and AP Research students must submit final performance tasks and their presentations must be scored by their AP Seminar or AP Research teachers by 11:59 p.m. ET on May 1, 2023.
- On their AP Digital Portfolio, students participating in AP Computer Science Principles must submit their Create performance task as final by 11:59 p.m. ET on May 1, 2023.
