

FAFSA Frequent Asked Questions

Will the FAFSA affect any other benefits a student gets such as food stamps or disability benefits?

No. The FAFSA only uses this information to determine the student's financial need.

What year do I choose?

What does Work-Study mean?

Work Study is a federal program that provides part-time jobs for students with financial needs, allowing them to earn money to help pay education expenses. Work-Study encourages community service work and work related to students' course of study.

Should I apply for Work-Study?

Yes, you can always turn down the job.

What is Selective Service?

Registration is a way our government keeps a list of names of men from which to draw in case of a national emergency requiring rapid expansion of our Armed Forces. By registering all young men, Selective Service ensures that a future draft will be fair and equitable.

NOTE: Registering with Selective Service does not mean you are joining the military.

Is it required that I register with Selective Service in order to receive financial aid?

No. Your registration status with the Selective Service System (SSS) no longer affects your eligibility to receive federal student aid; however, you can still register through the FAFSA form.
