In the event a person has raised a concern and is not satisfied with the coordinator's response, he/she has the right, within five working days of the coordinator's response, to file a written compliant with the building principal. The principal,



upon reviewing the complaint, will render a written decision within ten working days. If not satisfied with the principal's decision, the complainant may, within five working days, refer the complaint in writing to the Director of Personnel who will review the case and render a decision within ten working days. Within five working days of this decision, the complainant may appeal, in writing, to the superintendent.

GENERAL INFORMATION

AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION tuition fees confirm registration and must be paid in full. Registration is only accepted with full payment. Registrations are accepted in order of receipt and can be made in person, by mail or online through MyPaymentsPlus. Go to www.simsbury.k12. ct.us/dce to create your account. A class will be cancelled if minimum enrollment is not received. Early registrations help make these important decisions. The Director reserves the right to set minimum and maximum enrollment of courses/ travel programs and to cancel any course that does not maintain sufficient enrollment.

MATERIAL FEES and food fees are payable directly to the instructor (unless specified) at the first class. Amount varies according to class needs. Where materials are not specified, they will be discussed at the first session.

HANDICAP ACCOMMODATIONS are available for all programs offered by DCE. Programs are held in accessible locations. Accommodations for individuals with a disability are available upon request to our office.

WAITING LIST for filled classes will be maintained and calls made in sequential order if openings become available. Waiting lists for travel offerings will be maintained with paid registrations.

COUNSELING services are available by appointment to assist students in program planning and in selection of courses to meet requirements for diploma, employment, and/or college entrance. Career counseling is available.

FEE FOR INSUFFICIENT FUNDS will be \$20.00.

GIFT CERTIFICATES are available for any continuing education class or travel program. They may be purchased at anytime at the DCE office. The attractive certificate is an ideal gift for any occasion.

SMOKING POLICY of the Simsbury Board of Education is that smoking will not be permitted on school grounds at any time.

FEES AND CHARGES are applied due to the fact that the Department of Continuing Education is a self-sustaining program, sponsored by Simsbury Public Schools. Course fees are determined by the anticipated enrollment of the total program. Additional charges exist for certain required supplies/materials or classes offered by outside professional groups. Instructors will discuss additional fees at the first session, or you may call the DCE offices at (860) 658-3870. Fees for each program can be found in the course listings located in this brochure.

Additional course fees include a \$3 nonrefundable

registration fee. There is an additional \$10 non-resident, per person fee which applies to all programs (classes.) Senior citizens (62 and older) receive a 50% discount for regular class fees (not including the \$10 non-resident fee.) This does not apply to travel programs or material fees. There is no fee for students enrolling in the ESOL, ABE, Citizenship or GED classes that are taken in preparation for the high school equivalency degree.

FULL REFUND if a class is cancelled **FULL REFUND** for withdrawals prior to day of first class (does not include nonrefundable registration fee.)

50% REFUND for withdrawals from first day to end of first week (does not include nonrefundalbe registration fee.)

NO REFUND after the first week of the class has elapsed.

MATERIAL FEES are only refundable if a person or persons withdraw two weeks prior to course start.

REFUND CHECKS will be mailed approximately one (1) month after a course cancellation or refund request.

This policy does NOT apply to travel programs. Travel functions require substitutes. The DCE office will attempt to keep a paid waiting list to alleviate problems.

PARKING will be available in designated areas around the school buildings only. Please do not park in fire lanes or handicapped areas!

CLASSES

High school students are eligible to take evening adult classes with written permission from their high school principal.

CANCELLATIONS due to emergency situations or inclement weather will be announced on WTIC, WFSB, NBC, FOX CT and the town web site. Classes will be rescheduled at the convenience of the class and instructor. If the public schools are cancelled or closed early all evening and afternoon programs are postponed. ADULT STATE MANDATED EDUCATION/GED®

FACTS ABOUT THE GED® (General Educational Development) Test

The standardized GED test is designed for those 17 years or older who do not have a high school diploma. However, individuals under 18 years of age should contact the State Mandated Supervisor to determine eligibility. To register for the test an applicant must be 17 years of age or older and no longer enrolled in school. Applicants 17 and 18 years old must submit documentation that they have either been withdrawn from school for at least six months, or that the class in which they entered (or would have entered) ninth grade has already graduated.

The test is free to those eligible applicants under 21 years of age as a result of State funding. An applicant 21 years of age or older and a non-veteran must pay an initial fee of \$13 to take the test. Only veterans and applicants under the age of 21 are exempt from fees. Veterans must have served at least 181 days of active duty at the time of registration.

The new test consists of four sections: Math, Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies. The test is now only offered on computer at specified testing sites across Connecticut.

Our GED Test Preparation program offers small class sizes, a relaxed atmosphere, and essential instruction to help prepare individuals for the standardized test. The Department of Continuing Education is here to help individuals meet their educational goals. Information is available throughout the year, so do not hesitate to call DCE at (860) 658-3870.




