Funding will be used to purchase new digital and print textbooks for students and correlating resources for the classroom teachers. These resources will give students and teachers direct access to the most up-to-date curriculum available in print and digital formats. The resources will allow students digital access in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in a remote and/or blended environment. The resources will also provide students with on-going opportunities to engage in fiction and non-fiction text which will address literacy skills regardless of the content area. Professional development will be provided for the teachers to equip them to use these resources using sound instructional practices.

The support provided will target specific skills that are noted as being areas of deficit according to data.

ARP ESSER funds will be used to employ one system-wide Reading / EL specialist (1.0 FTE) for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years to assist with the consistent increase of EL students within the district and provide assistance in Reading Instruction . In addition to working with students, the Reading / EL will work with classroom teachers to ensure appropriate instructional strategies are implemented.
