### Honors Diploma

- English (4 Credits 2 must be Advanced Level)
- Social Studies (4 Credits 2 must be Advanced Level)
- Math (4 Credits- 2 must be Advanced Level, Alg2/Trig, and Pre-Cal unless substituted by AP or Dual Enrollment)
- Science (4 Credits 2 must include Advanced Level)
- Foreign Language (2 Credits- must include 2 units of the same language) <u>OR</u> AP Computer Science Principles
- Physical Education (1 Credit) (Marching Band may substitute for PE)
- Health (½ Credit)
- Career Tech Elective <u>and/or</u> Fine Art (3 Credits)
- Career Preparedness (1 Credit)
- 2.5 Electives
- 5 Courses <u>must</u> be AP or Dual Enrollment
  - Total of 26 Credits

\*For an additional Career Technical Endorsement 3 of the 26 credits must be CT courses.

# NCAA Eligibility www.eligibilitycenter.org

- NCAA Division I requirements:
  - 10 out of the 16 required cores have to be completed by the end of your junior year
  - Must have a core 2.3 GPA
  - They will allow a minimum of 2.0 GPA, but you will not be allowed to play your freshman year of college
  - \*If you are a current junior or sophomore considering playing sports after high school and are <u>NOT</u> on advanced or honors diploma you will need to meet with your counselor.

# Why AP?

- AP courses help students acquire the skills and habits demanded for success in college.
- College and Career Readiness Preparation
- Students establish rigorous study habits, improve writing skills, sharpen problem-solving abilities, develop time management skills, and strengthen self-discipline.
- Students may earn college credit while enrolled in high school courses.

## AP & the Cost of College

- AP students are more likely to graduate from college in 4 years, which only 26.5% of U. S. public college students achieve.
- The average cost of a 4 year public institution is \$18,000 for every year, in state.
- If a student earns a qualifying score in an AP course and receives college credit, the family saves \$1,800 which is the average cost of a 3 hour course at Alabama & Auburn
- AP helps students qualify for college scholarship dollars. 31% of colleges use AP as a criterion when determining scholarship recipients.
  - Colleges use AP to place students in appropriate level courses.

### What does college cost?

### **Auburn University**

- Tuition & Fees=\$5,913
- Books-\$800
- Room & Board-\$7,298
- Total=\$14,011/semester (\$112,088 four year total)

### University of Alabama

- Tuition & Fees=\$5,390
- Books-\$800
- Room & Board-\$6,967
- Total=\$13,157/semester (\$105,256 four year total)
- Note: Out of state tuition is usually 2-3 times that of an in-state student regardless of college.

Students who meet the specific criteria of Policy No. 803.01, as Alabama residents, are eligible to pay the following tuition and fees:



# FCHS Career Tech Programs

- Health Science
- Architecture & Construction
- Business Management

- If you complete a sequence of <u>3 courses</u> in <u>one</u> of these areas, a CT endorsement is added to your diploma.
- Fine Arts count towards your career tech electives

### Academic Dual Enrollment

- Earning a high school credit and a college credit at the same time.
- Juniors and Seniors are eligible to take academic DE.
- For math (22) and English (18) students must have the minimum ACT score required or a required ACCUPLACER (Math 20, English 18) score to be eligible to take these courses.
- Academic DE is weighted with a +10.
- Academic DE costs approximately \$500 per class.
- All courses are taught at BSCC.
- No transportation provided
- All BSCC paperwork must be completed by certain timelines.

# Academic DE Course Offerings

- English Composition 101 and 102 (11 & 12)
- Biology with Lab 103 (12)
- Math 112 and 113 or 115 and 125 (12)
- U.S. History 201 and 202 (11 & 12)
  - \*See your grade level pathway sheet
  - \*Sequence may depend on college course of study

### Career Technical Dual Enrollment

- Earning a high school credit and a college credit at the same time.
- Students in grades 10 12 are eligible.
- Required GPA of 2.0 except for Career Pathways which requires a 3.0.
- No cost to courses for with dual enrollment scholarship.
- Most of the courses are taught at BSCC.
- Transportation is provided to BSCC.
- All BSCC paperwork must be completed by certain timelines.
