WHAT'S NEW IN 3RD GRADE:

Third graders are working hard at Tolland Intermediate School. In Math, many classes are wrapping up the division unit. They are learning strategies to solve two-step real-world problems with multiplication and division. In classes we are working on mastering multiplication and division facts with games, as well as Reflex Math. Recently, usernames and passwords went home for IXL. We'll be using this in class, as well as encouraging kids to try it at home to work on various math skills. Please have your child continue to practice math facts using Reflex, IXL, and math games at home.

We have wrapped up our Opinion writing unit in Writer's Workshop. Third graders did a wonderful job writing their opinion on topics of their choice. We will begin our Information Unit and we are looking forward to hearing about what topics your child is an expert on. We'll start in our Writer's Notebooks and then write information books on topics of their choice. In Language Arts, classes are reading stories in Houghton Mifflin, Journeys as well as the Wonders program. We are using these resources as well as guided reading to work on comprehension skills. Please continue to have your third grader read at home every night.

Our fossils science unit is really keeping kids engaged. Using real photographs of fossils, your explorers are acting like paleontologists and discovering where the animals lived, what they ate, and other characteristics. We'll also explore footprints of fossils. All classes had the experience of seeing triops hatch from eggs and grow to adults. The kids love making observations each day, feeding the triops, and learning about their life cycles.

WHAT'S NEW IN 4th GRADE:

I do not know about you but I feel like 2019 is already zooming by! We are off to a very productive start in 2019. We're on our way to finishing up Chapter 6 fractions unit and then we'll be moving right into working on decimals. After the New Year, we took the Mid-Year assessment in math, which covered chapters 1, 2, 3, and 6. As a whole class, they are definitely improving on their fact fluency but as we always say, "Practice makes perfect!" so keep up the great work!

In LA, our current unit has been our most "informational" one (since we're in INFORMATIONAL®). We have been reading great stories and articles and talking about the structures and features you will find while reading informational texts. During writing, we've carried over what the kids have been reading and they have been also researching and even begun writing about different animals.

In Social Studies, the class has completed the Map Skills unit and is working finishing unit 2 on the Northeast Region. After the Northeast Region as a grade level the 4th graders will be moving into Unit 2 for science.

Last but definitely not least! The 4^{th} Grade Valentine's Day Dance is coming up Friday the 8^{th} . This is a great opportunity for our 4^{th} grade students to bring their favorite adult to a fun social event here at TIS. It will be located upstairs in the all-purpose room, where you will find a DJ, food refreshment, and all kinds of sweet treats for purchase. There will be a \$15 per couple charge at the door. We hope to see you there!

WHAT'S NEW IN 5th GRADE:

The 5th grade students are getting excited for Esteem Day. Our students will spend the entire school day with Canton High School students. They will participate and watch skits and on a variety of self-esteem topics. Students will also be able to show off their amazing dance skills. Be sure to mark your calendar and join us for the evening performance, Tuesday, February 5th at 6:00 pm.

In language arts, students are working on research based arguments. Students are writing about whether or not schools should serve chocolate milk. Students have conducted research and added their own personal opinion. Students will then choose a topic they are passionate about and write an opinion essay based on their research. Ask your child what topic they are writing about.

Students are learning about early colonization of America. Students are reading about Roanoke, Jamestown, and Plymouth. We will soon move on to the thirteen original colonies.

Fifth grade students are beginning their fractions units. The units includes students solving real-world style problems. These problems are fairly complex, but the students will be using their bar modeling strategies to solve them. They are getting really good at different problem solving strategies.

In science, fifth graders are well into their unit on ecosystems. Students have been researching abiotic and biotic factors that help ecosystems to thrive. The main organism students are focused on are the Golden Jellyfish of Lake Palau. Well done fifth grade scientists.


