- Athletes, know your NCAA number. If you have not registered, do so at www.eligibilitycenter.org.
- Visit colleges in person or through a virtual tour on the college's website.
- Remember to use the pre-excused absence form if you go on a college visit trip. These forms are available in the Attendance Office.

Service Learning is no longer a graduation requirement. Students who have recorded at least 117 hours will be members of the Millennium Club and receive a cord to wear for Baccalaureate and Commencement ceremonies

Preparing for Life After High School

- High school graduation does not guarantee admission to college.
 - Re-examine your schedule often to enhance academic rigor.
 - Strive for good grades, perhaps retake a class to improve your grade. See your counselor for guidance on this opportunity.
- Colleges have different admissions requirements; check the specific college website for their requirements.
- Know your ACT score. If you need to re-take it or need the ACT with Writing exam, go to www.act.org. High School code is 060-695. Does the school you are considering require an SAT score? If so, register for the test at www. collegeboard.com.
- Once you submit your college application, you are obligated to inform them of any schedule changes which reduce the academic quality of your senior year.
 - Request your official transcripts for college through NAVIANCE.
 - Remember to apply to colleges as early as possible. See your counselor for questions.

SENIOR INFORMATION (Continued)

- Students assume the ultimate responsibility for accurately selecting and passing the courses required for graduation and post-secondary options.
 - Compete the FAFSA by March 1. Watch for the dates of Financial Aid workshops. Many scholarships will require a student has completed a FAFSA, regardless of family income.
 - Apply for scholarships as they become available. Check the NAVIANCE site for messages and the Scholarship List.
- Complete your Resume. There is a Resume builder in the NAVIANCE program!
- You may need letters of recommendation for college, employment, and military. It is polite to ask for a letter two weeks before the due date, along with a copy of your resume.
- Students considering Military Options must take the ASVAB test.

COUNSELING NEWS

Middle School Credit

Reminder for Juniors: March 1st is the final day for juniors to add or delete a middle school grade from their transcripts if they took a high school level course. Paperwork can be picked up and dropped off in the counseling office at GJHS for adjusting middle school grades and credits.

The ultimate goal for the counseling team is to have teachers leave GJHS with their schedules for 2017-2018 by the last day of school. The communication is so much better when we are able to complete the plan while teachers are still in the building. Because the district already has a calendar for next year in place, we will have roll over take place on February 20th, which means course requests can be entered after that date. So, here is the plan for a quick turnaround without a lot of extra work put on teachers:

calling down 10th graders to spend approximately 15 minutes entering their course

requests into computers.)

11th Graders

February 16th Juniors will attend a registration meeting in the auditorium during advisory; they will

receive materials and learn the registration process.

February 28th 11th Grade Registration Work Day (Counselors will be in the library the entire day

calling down 11th graders to spend approximately 15 minutes entering their course

requests into computers.)

ASVAB

On March 10th, from 9am to noon in the Central HS library, the ASVAB exam will be offered to all interested juniors and seniors in School District #51. There is no school that day, so no class time will be missed. ASVAB is the military entrance exam, but is also an excellent tool for students with no interest in the military to help identify their strengths, interests, and vocational or career prospects. It can also count toward the proficiencies required for graduation. In accordance with the agreement among our military recruiters, only the student can initiate contact following the exam. If you are interested in taking the exam, please sign up in the Counseling Office by March 6th. Seating is limited and available on a first come, first serve basis.

GIRLS BASKETBALL

The Tiger Girls' Basketball Team finished the non-conference schedule this season with back to back wins over Steamboat Springs and Westminster, gaining valuable momentum going into conference play. 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

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CHSAA HALL OF FAME

Grand Junction High School Alum joins the Colorado High School Activities Association Hall of Fame

Ray Coca, a three-time state wrestling champion at Grand Junction High School, has recently been inducted into the CHSAA Hall of Fame. Coca posted a career 59-1-1 mark. Of his 12 state matches, he won seven by pin. His only loss came when he moved up in weight to take the place of an injured teammate.

Ray went on to Western State where he again starred on the wrestling mat, going undefeated as a freshman and earning all-American honors in 1964 when his team won the national title. He officiated 10 district and one state championship tournaments. He remains active in the community as noted in his awards from the city as a Hometown Hero on at least two occasions.

Ray was also the sports editor for the local newspaper for a number of years, promoting prep sports at a high level for the schools on the Western Slope. Grand Junction High School is proud to recognize Ray Coca as a CHSAA Hall of Fame member.
