# What is a School Reunification?

Reunification is when students are reunited with parents after an incident, such as an evacuation or a lockdown lasting past regular school dismissal time. The process ensures all students are accounted for, safely returned to their parents, and only taken home by people they trust. Reunification will take place either at a school or a pre-designated alternate site. Parents are notified of the location prior to pick-up.

Please be patient and remain calm - reunification can take a while, but it keeps kids safe. Here's how it works:

- 1. Parents will be directed to a single entry point where they will need to show photo I.D. and fill out a form.
- 2. Once inside the site, the parent or guardian will be directed to a specific location where school staff will confirm a parent or guardian's information.
- 3. Once their information is verified, the parent or guardian waits in a designated area while their student is escorted to the parent or guardian. At no point should a parent enter a secured area where students are located.
- 4. Once reunited and the child has been signed out, the parent and student will leave the building through designated doors.
- In the majority of incidents, parents or guardians will have to pick up students who walk or get a ride home from school. Students who ride buses can ride the bus unless parents are otherwise notified. Buses may be delayed due to the incident.
- If a parent/guardian is unavailable to participate in reunification, please call the school as soon as you are notified that reunification is taking place to tell staff who will be picking up your child.

The Taylor staff has been working on how this process will look at our school should we ever need to do this. Fortunately we have never had to do a reunification, but we want to be prepared in case we ever need to. We are working with the district to fine-tune our plan and will be practicing a drill with staff in March/April. Give us a call if you have any questions.

Supporting Reading at Home - a child spends 900 hours a year in school (with good attendance) and 7,800 hours at home. Who's the most important teacher? You are! Here are some strategies that you can use at home to support your child's reading.

#### Before reading:

Use the cover, the back of the book, the author's blurb, the table of contents, and other book features to predict what may happen in the book.

Make sure the book is an appropriate book that matches your reading strategies and interests. Read the first page or two and ask yourself if you are able to understand the story so far.

#### During reading:

Reread. Each day when you begin to read, reread the page or two that you finished the day before. This will help you to remember what is happening in the story.

Go back and reread a sentence or two if you do not understand.

Stop and talk about parts in the story that make you angry, surprise you, remind you of something that has happened to you, or remind you of another book that you have read.

Listen for clues that tell you what may happen next.

Stop and think for a minute about what you have just read.

Most importantly, spend some time together reading and talking about books every day. Reading should be an enjoyable experience for your family.
