In the 5th Grade Classroom

The 5th grade team will work with students and their families....

- ◆ Meet and communicate with parents throughout the year.
- ◆ Provide a variety of leveled literary and informational text for students to read independently.
- ◆ Monitor student progress with updates to parents through phone calls, Power School..
- ◆ Make sure each student receives the help he/she needs as soon as identified through progress monitoring.
- ◆ Send home strategic learning materials to support Reading and Math related to Common Core.
- ◆ Use a variety of teaching strategies for Reading and Math to ensure I can reach students of all levels.
- ◆ Ensure students understand assignments, the purpose and what will be learned through daily learning targets.
- ◆ Work with students and their families to prepare them for Middle School.
- ◆ Prepare students for implementation of standardized test—Smarter Balanced.

At Home: Frank G. Regan school parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' reading ability and comprehension.

- ◆ Encourage my child to read every day.
- ◆ Attend workshops (when I am available) that are offered by the school and district.
- ◆ Communicate with my child's teacher throughout the year.
- ◆ Check and maintain student communication folders on a daily basis.
- ◆ Provide a quiet homework area.
- ◆ View school and district website to stay informed of schedules, activities and updates
- ◆ Sign and return report card envelop
- ◆ **I will make every effort to have my child attend school every day and on time.**
