SAT/ACT

- **Free Senior S.A.T. School Day** October 16, 2019.
 - For alternate dates go to collegeboard.org.
or act.org (for ACT).
- *Remember to send your test scores to the universities that you plan to apply to. Most universities accept scores through December.

CSU Admissions

- Application window opens **October 1, 2019 to November 30, 2019.**
- Complete an application for each campus - applications are sent to each campus.
- The minimum required GPA for admission eligibility is a 2.0 - the lower the GPA, the higher the test scores must be (SAT Reasoning test or ACT).
- SAT Subject tests are not required.
- The application fee is **\$70** - fee waivers are available within the application.
- GPA is based on grades earned during the sophomore and junior years of high school (a-g approved courses only).

UC Admissions

- The UC Admissions uses the Comprehensive Review, where evaluators look beyond test scores and grades to evaluate applicants' academic achievement in light of the opportunities available to them and the capacity each student demonstrates to contribute to the intellectual life of the campus.
- The application fee is **\$70** - fee waiver available within the application.
- The UC application evaluation considerations consists of the following:
 - A. Academic GPA in all completed A-G courses
 - B. Scores from ACT with writing and/or SAT with essay
 - C. Number of UC approved honors and AP courses
 - D. Personal Insight Questions- Must answer 4 out of 8 questions. Be sure to edit/proofread these before submitting.

Who Should Apply for EOP Educational Opportunity Program?

- Available on UC & CSU campuses
- A separate application
- Provides many helpful services(tutoring, etc)
- Historically low-income and educationally disadvantaged undergraduate students who will benefit from admission assistance and support services to succeed in college
- Students who demonstrate academic potential and motivation/First Generation to attend college
- California residents and students who qualify for AB 540 nonresident tuition exemption

Private Colleges

- **76+ campuses in California**, each with a unique focus: liberal arts colleges, major research universities, comprehensive universities, church- and faith-related institutions, historically black colleges and universities, single-sex institutions, two-year colleges, and schools of law, medicine, engineering, art, business, and other professions.
- **Professors** – *not teaching assistants* – teach courses.
- Private schools tend to have a more **personal approach** to education. The admissions policies at private schools are also more personal, looking to student promise, talent. Private school application **deadlines** are not uniform.
- **Tuition and fees** can be in excess of \$30,000 a year – however, roughly 8 out of 10 students who attend private schools receive some forms of **financial aid!** Need-based and/or academic merit!

SEND.EDU/THE COMMON APP

- Applications for most private universities can be submitted through send.edu.org and www.commonapp.com.
- Students should create their accounts through send.edu or commonapp.org and include their teachers' and counselors' emails so that all recommendations, transcripts, and other documents can be electronically submitted on their behalf.
- Ask your counselor/teacher/coach at least 2 weeks in advance for a letter of recommendation.

Tips

- BE FLEXIBLE... The level of competition for admission to many campuses and programs can be quite high, so please consider the following:
 - apply to more than one campus
 - apply to programs that, while not your first choice, will allow you to fulfill your educational goals
- **Meet all application deadlines**
- Proofread your application for misspellings and grammatical errors
- Be sure you meet A-G Eligibility. If you have any grades below a C, ask your counselor about Credit Recovery/Adult School. Remember to include these classes as part of your senior year coursework.
- Be sure to hit the “**submit**” button
- Do not omit required signatures
- Read directions carefully
- Do not list extracurricular activities that *aren't legitimate*
- Inform your school counselor where you have applied
- **Use a *tasteful* e-mail address that you will check often**

Important Senior Reminders

- Testing for SAT Reasoning and ACT must be completed by the end of December, however, verify each university's deadline. Go online to www.collegeboard.com and <http://www.actstudent.org/>.
- UC applications November 1st – 30th
- CSU applications October 1st – November 30th
- Complete your resume and ask for letters of recommendation early; letters of recommendation are NOT a part of the UC or CSU application.
- Attend our Financial Aid night Sept. 26, 2019.
