## At Home Learning Activities

Practice counting to 120 by 1s, 10s, 5s, and 2s.  Read a book to your favorite stuffed animal.	Write numbers from 1-120.  Read a book under a tree.	Use 11 paper bags and write a number from 0-10 on it. Make flashcards for addition math facts. Students find the sum of each fact and place it in the matching bag.	Use 11 paper bags and write a number from 0-10 on it. Make flashcards for subtraction math facts. Students find the difference of each fact and place it in the matching bag.	Sort coins from your piggy bank and make a chart of how many pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters you have. How much money did you save?
Make sight words flash cards. Place them face down in rows and columns. Flip a card over and read it. If you read it correctly, keep the card.	Sort sight word flashcards in ABC order.  Make a paper airplane and fly it outside.	Play a different version of "Sight Words Around the World." Place 10 different household items or souvenirs around the room as spots for traveling around the world. Have a parent show you a sight word flashcard. If you read it correctly, you can travel to the next spot.	Place sight word flashcards around the room. Do a fun walk to collect a sight word that your parents say.  Some examples are penguin walk, crab walk, robot walk, floss and walk, walk with high knees, and crawl.	Play "Find the Fish Game" using sight words flashcards. Place the cards with words facing up in rows and columns. Have a family member hide a picture of a fish under one sight word. Read the sight word correctly to check if the fish is hiding under that card.
Write a story about a time when you were happy.  Play a board game with your family.	Write a letter to someone.  Find your favorite book and read it to someone.	Read a story. Write your own ending to the story.  Play a card game with your family.	Read a book out loud using different voices such as robot voice, pirate voice, squeaky voice, and low voice.	Watch a movie. Then write about your favorite part.  Play a video game with your family.
With an adult, mix water and oil in a clear container. What happens when you stir it? Then add 5 drops of food coloring. Watch what happens.	Make bubbles with an adult. Mix 2 cups of water, 1/4 cup of dish soap, 1 tablespoon of light corn syrup. Tie some straws in a bunch to make a bubble wand. Play bubbles outside.	With help from an adult, fill a cup of water and mark the water line on the cup. Put the cup outside and predict what will happen. Observe it once every hour.	Have an adult mix $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of vinegar and 1 teaspoon of salt into a bowl. Place some brown, old pennies in that bowl for a few minutes. Watch what happens.	Observe the sky. What do you see? Identify shapes and pictures in the clouds.  Build an obstacle course and see how long it takes for you to complete it.
