Qualitative Research Question

How do students feel about discipline and behavioral policies at Folwell and are there any changes students feel should be made?

Methods:

- Focus group with 7th and 8th grade students
 - Students were randomly selected
 - Diverse sampling

Questions asked during focus group:

- 1. If you were the principal, what would you change at Folwell and why?
- 2. When you think about Folwell, what things are fair, what things are unfair?
- 3. What are the advantages and disadvantages of recess?
- 4. Have you ever been in trouble or had a friend get in trouble? If so, did you think the consequences were fair, why or why not?
- 5. What types of things do you think students should be suspended for? What types of things should they not be suspended for?
- 6. According to Folwell's behavior data, most behavioral incidents happen during or right after lunch. What do you think contributes to this?

Conclusions/Observations about behavioral policies and procedures:

- Buddy Rooms don't seem to always work
- Some students just want to be rebellious/cool/try to annoy teacher
- If teachers can't handle what's going on, they call behavior. Students get phone call home and detention.
- Students will try to convince teacher not to call parent by saying parent won't care.
- 8th grade "points system" for trip to Valley Fair is unfair. Students feel behavior should not be tied to earning this trip.
- The way we are graded on homework and tests seems fair.

Recommendations/changes students feel should be made for next year:

- Allow us to wear hoodies. People get kicked out of class a lot for this. Could eliminate some concerns.
- Have all teachers follow same procedures (buddy room example...not every teacher follows it).
- Allow all grades time for recess.
- Establish clear expectations at the beginning of the school year for ALL students
- Allow more out of uniform days as an incentive
