#### LAUDE SYSTEM

- Students earning Laude Distinctions will be recognized with stoles at graduation.
- Students must have an Indexed Cumulative GPA of 3.4 or higher to be considered.
- The purpose of the Laude System is to reward graduating students who perform at a high academic level and choose a challenging academic course load.
- Courses with a designation of AP, Honors, CAPP and CLEP all earn 1 laude point for every .5 credit earned.

#### GRADE INDEXING 101

- .025 Is added to the student's GPA for each ½ credit that they are enrolled in an INDEXED Class.
- Courses that are indexed are labeled as AP (Advanced Placement), CAPP, CLEP and Honors.
- Example
  - Cindy takes AP Human Geography and earns a "B" for each quarter. She has earned a 3.0 GPA for each quarter. Her indexed GPA will be 3.025 for each quarter as this is a two quarter course. Also, she also has earned 2 Laude Points.



#### Opportunities for earning College Credit

- CAPP (6) ~ CAPP stands for Cooperative Academic Partnership Program. Our teachers are certified to teach their curriculum so our student can earn college credit from UW Oshkosh. These credits may be transferred to other colleges by sending a transcript from UW Oshkosh to your destination college.
- <u>CLEP (2)</u> ~ CLEP stands for the College Level Examination Program. <u>CLEP</u> exams help students earn college credit for what they already know, for a fraction of the cost of a college <u>course</u>.
- AP (20) ~ AP stands for Advanced Placement. Students complete our curriculum and then take the AP Exam in the spring and if they earn a 3 or higher on the exam, can earn college credit. The cost of the AP Exam for this year was \$95.
- <u>Transcripted Credit (14)</u> ~ Transcripted Credit is also known as dual enrollment courses. A student in high school signs up for a course that has an agreement with a post-secondary institution and if they meet the requirements of the course, the student receives high school and college credit...for free!
- Advanced Standing (3) ~ Advanced Standing is the recognition of previous successful study which may be relevant and may be applied to a program at a technical college. These classes can be credited to your technical college program and could reduce the number of subjects you need to complete to earn your certification and/or degree.
