Day 21&22: China's control over a remote western territory has forced the traditional spiritual leader of this region to live in exile for nearly 70 years. Address the following in your answer.

- a) Name the territory (as known outside of China), the leader, and the religion.
- b) Describe the history between China and this region.
- c) Explain how tensions between political doctrine and the authority of religious leaders reflects the contrasting views of landscape by sacred and secular forces.

Day 23 & 24: Kurdistan is a nation without a state. Describe how the geography and spatial distribution of the Kurds in Asia challenges nationalism and discuss on the persistence of persecution they encounter across geographic boundaries.

Day 25: Identify and explain the factors that resulted in the forced migration of 17 million people in South Asia during the late 1940s? (Include India and Pakistan)

Day 26 & 27: Geographers have noted an international trend away from unitary towards federal forms of government.

- a) Define federal government and contrast it with a unitary form.
- b) Identify what size of country in which each system might work best.
- c) Discuss why you think this is a growing trend in the twenty-first century.

Day 28: In addition to the events of September 11, 2001, identify and summarize two foreign terrorist attacks on U.S. soil and two domestic terrorist attacks by American citizens on U.S. soil.

Day 29 & 30: Identify and describe the main features that distinguish commercial agriculture from subsistence agriculture. Explain how each type of agriculture responds to the need to increase productivity.
