

A Day in the Life




- ⑩ School starts at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m.

- ⑩ Early release Wednesdays- school ends at 12:30 p.m. and the buses leave at 1:00 p.m.

Student Expectations



- ⑩ 9th grade students are expected to stay on campus during lunch.
 - ⑩ Students do not need to eat in the cafeteria- they can be anywhere in the building or outside 😊
- ⑩ Students can bring their backpacks to class. 9th grade students will also be assigned a locker.
- ⑩ Cell phones should be off and away.
 - ⑩ Teachers will communicate their specific cell phone policy during the first week of school
