

The School

Griswold High School is a four year comprehensive high school which offers an abundance of curricular and co-curricular programs. Accredited through the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, Griswold offers eight Career Pathways that provide college and career preparation for all students. In addition to a rigorous academic program, there are numerous other student-centered athletic, artistic and leadership opportunities. During the 2014/2015 school year, there are 588 students enrolled.

The Faculty

Griswold High School has a total of 56 academic faculty, three school counselors, a career coordinator, an academic academy coordinator, a school psychologist and a school social worker.

The Community

Griswold, which includes the Borough of Jewett City, is a rural community located in eastern Connecticut. In addition to educating Griswold students, the high school is a tuition school to the bordering towns of Voluntown, Canterbury & Lisbon. With power from the Quinebaug and Pachaug Rivers, Jewett City was once a prosperous mill town. Today, the gaming and tourism industry provide job opportunities and development for the region. Nestled in New London County, Griswold residents enjoy the pleasure of rural living in this quiet mill town setting.

- College Career Pathway (CCP) is an option available for concurrent credit with Three Rivers Community College or Quinebaug Valley Community College for up to 14 college credits.
- Early College Experience (ECE) offers the opportunity for concurrent credit with the University of Connecticut in English or Individual & Family Development.
- Virtual High School (VHS) is available to earn credit via on-line courses.
- Every student declares a career pathway their freshman year and takes a series of courses within that pathway. Pathway options include: Fine Arts, Media Technology & Communications, Business, Health Sciences, Hospitality, Education & Human Services, Manufacturing or Construction Technologies & Design.

Determining Quality Points

Advanced Final Grade x 1.2 = Quality Points

Example: $80 \times 1.2 = 96.0$

Honors Final Grade x 1.15 = Quality Points

Example: $80 \times 1.15 = 92.0$

Level I Final Grade x 1.10 = Quality Points

Example: $80 \times 1.10 = 88.0$

Level II Final Grade x 1.05 = Quality Points

Example: $80 \times 1.05 = 84.0$

Level III Final Grade x 1.00 = Quality Points

Example: $80 \times 1.00 = 80.0$
